

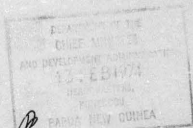

The diary reveals the patrol was largely in the nature of day trips from Buku. Four (4) nights were actually spent in the villages.


All points raised in the patrol instructions seem to have been covered adequately.

3. Investigate any complaints or disputes, arbitrate in them where appropriate and send into NUKU any cases requiring a Court hearing.
4. Check to see that all Firearms and Store licences are current. Send into NUKU any person who does not hold a current licence, for Court action.
5. Answer any queries on political developments and conduct discussions where appropriate.
6. With the concurrence of Officers of the NUKU Local Government Council, check on Council road maintenance work; organise and supervise any work that needs to be done.

Attend to any other matters as may be required by the Officer In Charge NUKU.

Following your return from patrol submit a report promptly in the required format. Situation Reports are only required in respect of matters that you consider should be brought to the notice of Departmental Headquarters, Konedobu.

I shall advise you later regarding your movement to NUKU which will be during the week commencing 17th September.

The Assistant District Commissioner's Patrol Instructions 67-3-6 of 12th September, 1973 refers...

1. The Patrol departed NUKU station on the 24th September into the MAKU-KIAPETI Census Division as instructed by the OIG Nuku per Assistant District Commissioner.
2. Census was conducted respectively for all villages and also the transfer of names from the old Census Book to the new one was done.
3. An Area Study Update has been compiled on separate pages for each subject heading.
4. Political Education was conducted every evening on informal basis in some villages and before census in others. The interests shown by the villagers were impressive.
5. All minor complaints were heard and arbitrated.
6. A shotgun was brought into Nuku station to be checked up with the records held at the office, whilst having different serial number on the owner's licence.
7. Lists of all shotguns and trade store licences have been compiled.
8. All other matters as directed by the Assistant District Commissioner were attended to.
9. Constable 1st Class AMU was very helpful during this patrol.
10. Situation Reports 1 to 3.
11. Due to having only one typewriter available at the Sub-District Office, the report was delayed.

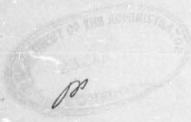

Receipt of Mr. Tari's report is acknowledged. His claim for camping allowance has been funded.

My only comments are as follows:-

- (a) The land dispute mentioned on Folio 20 of Mr Tari's F.O.J. He fails to make mention in the patrol report of this and also fails to mention whether the agreement reached between the dispute parties was recorded in the appropriate village books for the reference of future patrolling officers.
- (b) As stated by yourself, Mr. Tari would do well to take a little more care with his expression. However, this should be rectified with experience.
- (c) Mr Tari fails to mention of any political education discussions he may have had with the people of this area. From his report it is evident that these people are an energetic lot, and it seems strange that no political education was claimed out by the patrolling Officer.
- (d) It is suprising that no Situation Reports were prepared in respect to the area patrolled. Please have Mr. Tari peruse the appropriate circular pertaining to the type of information required by Headquarters in the form of sitreps.

I am surprised that no Situation Reports have been prepared in respect to the area.

Some matters of Situation Report significance have been incorporated in the Patrol Report itself.

Support for the Council and Councillors is heartening.

The House of Assembly Member is Yakel Talis of Ningil (AV East)

Part of the reason for the Seim Area being orientated to cash cropping is that they are traditional gardeners not sago gatherers as are the large majority of the Sub-District population.

Completion of the Bongos causeway will be a real boon to the progress and communications for the area.

It is pleasing to note the acceptance of responsibility for health services in the area.

The people must take care that inter-denominational rivalry and jealousy does not spoil community spirit and cohesiveness.

The patrol diary is quite detailed.

The updating of the Area Study appears to have been undertaken most conscientiously.

The Reporting Officer would do well to take a little more care with expression.

Generally an informative and well presented report.

A claim for Camping Allowance is enclosed.

(L) THE STAGE OF POLITICAL DEVELOPMENT.

1. The Seim Census Division as being the most Economical area are also aware of the political changes. Radio Wswak programmes are being tuned in for Political Education talks and also other political speeches. This is improving the people's understanding of Political changes taking place.
2. Self Government and Independence are still the two confusing and misused words.
3. The councillors are playing a major role towards economical progress and are well supported by the people in their area. The councillors are also well supported for road maintenace and road supervision and in fact they still do have the best road net work in the Nuku area. The Bongos Causeway which is due for construction soon is also supported by the council. The amount allocated to the Causeway is \$5,000.



(M) ECONOMIC OF THE AREA.

In the whole of the Seim Census Division there are 18,078 mature coffee trees and 9,238 immature ones. The total production for 1972-73 for coffee was 27,316 lbs and approximately 268 coffee growers. The total production for Paddy Rice was 327,837 lbs. These figures were released by the D.A.S.F. NUKU up to date statistics for 1972-73. The Seim Census Division is still the leading rice producing area with the adjacent Makru-Kaplei Census Division.

There is a newly established co-operative society now operating in the areas surveyed. However at this stage the writer can't tell how successful the society is functioning. The society has now a Toyota however its not operating at the moment due to some breakdown and needs new parts. The attitude of the people toward the forming of the society is satisfactory and that they would like to see it go ahead. Once the NUKU-Yagrombok road is up graded and the Bongos Causeway completed it would also mean a lot to the people and their Co-operative Society. The membership fee was \$40 per head and in fact the members were from besides Seim O/D the other Census Division of Nuku Patrol Post, not all the people but some and at this stage I can't tell how many members because there are still more people coming in.


