

Dear Brother Worcester February 1, 1711

Though I have not heard from you of a long time yet  
The Remembrance of you lives in my Heart and  
having this opportunity of Conveying no small comfort  
thos lines by which time and my mind and love  
with our Childrens service is presented to you and  
to our Sister your wife and to all our Sons and  
your Children hoping these lines will find you  
all in Health as we are at this instant writing  
and did by a former Conveyance send a Letter  
to you since I heard from you but know not  
whether it came to your hand but should exceedingly  
be glad to hear that you were surviving and  
well and could I come to you by Land or hundreds  
of miles should not soome mire to me to come  
to see you But pray Brother if this finds you in  
the Land of the living strive not to send unto  
me by this Letter for he is a very gentle Gentle-  
man and if you send a Letter or any thing else  
by him if it comes safe to Bristol it will certifi-  
cally come to my hand certifying you that I am  
mine by heavens Providence and our carefull  
endeavours safe above mount thought now doo not  
distrust but that this would make us very full  
is to have of all your answering and what ever  
you send to me whether it be a Letter or  
any thing else direct to me to be sent with  
Captain Goff living in the Caledon Green in  
Bristol and he will safely convey it to me  
thus hoping to have of ours your well being  
at the Receipte of this Letter I Rest & Remain  
your loving Brother Henry Hall
