Letter of Proposal to the China Administration for  
Travel and Tourism: Part II

The Committee of Concerned Asian Scholars national Selection Committee recently met to select a second CCAS Friendship Delegation to visit China. The following thirty individuals are qualified representatives of the organization as a whole in terms of region, sex and age.

We selected thirty individuals in accordance with our proposal of November 23, 1971. If you are able to accommodate this number, please contact us at your earliest convenience so that we can notify them. If a smaller number would be more convenient, please indicate (we hope not less than twenty). We would also like to finalize the time for the trip. Please let us know if our February 1972 date is still satisfactory to you.

As stated in our application, the second Friendship Delegation plans to meet all their own expenses without seeking any aid from U.S. government agencies or private foundations. Because our organization is basically comprised of students and young faculty, we would welcome the simplest accommodations available. Finally, if possible, we would like to receive an estimate of the costs per individual during the time spent in China.
