RENOWNED TAX EXPERT TO DISCUSS NEW TAX LAWS AND CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS

Nationally known tax attorney, lecturer and author Conrad Teitell will present a seminar on charitable contribution tax strategies on October 30.

The two-hour seminar, sponsored by the University of California, San Diego, will be held from 8 a.m. until 10 a.m. in the Scottish Rite Memorial Center, 1895 Camino Del Rio South. Admission is \$30.

The seminar is designed for professional advisors such as attorneys, certified public accountants, trust officers, chartered life insurance underwriters and financial planners. Emphasis will be on tax reform implications for charitable giving.

Teitell is a partner in a New York City law firm and is an adjunct visiting professor at the University of Miami School of Law. He holds a law degree from Columbia University.
