



To the Board of Directors of the
Linda Vista Irrigation District:

On the tenth day of May, 1895, the twelve hundred and fifty executed bonds of the District, for five hundred dollars each, of the issue of one million dollars, bearing date January 1st, 1892, numbered from 353 in numerical order to 1604, both inclusive, excepting Nos. 676 and 716, and which in the April preceding had been deposited in escrow with the First National Bank of San Diego, Cal. under the terms of agreement between the District and the Mountain Stream Water Company, were, with the consent of the Water Company, surrendered by the Bank to the District, the Bank delivering them to me as President of the Board of Directors of the District. Since that time they have been kept by me in two safes in the vault of the same bank, the Board formally approving of this disposition of them by resolution adopted at the regular monthly meeting held on the first Tuesday in June, 1895.

I now desire to be relieved of the custody of these bonds, and suggest that it would be appropriate at all times that the President of the Board should be appointed custodian of them.

If you will pass a resolution to this effect, and authorizing me to deliver the bonds to him I will be happy to meet him at the

Bank, and count them over and deliver them to him upon his receipt.

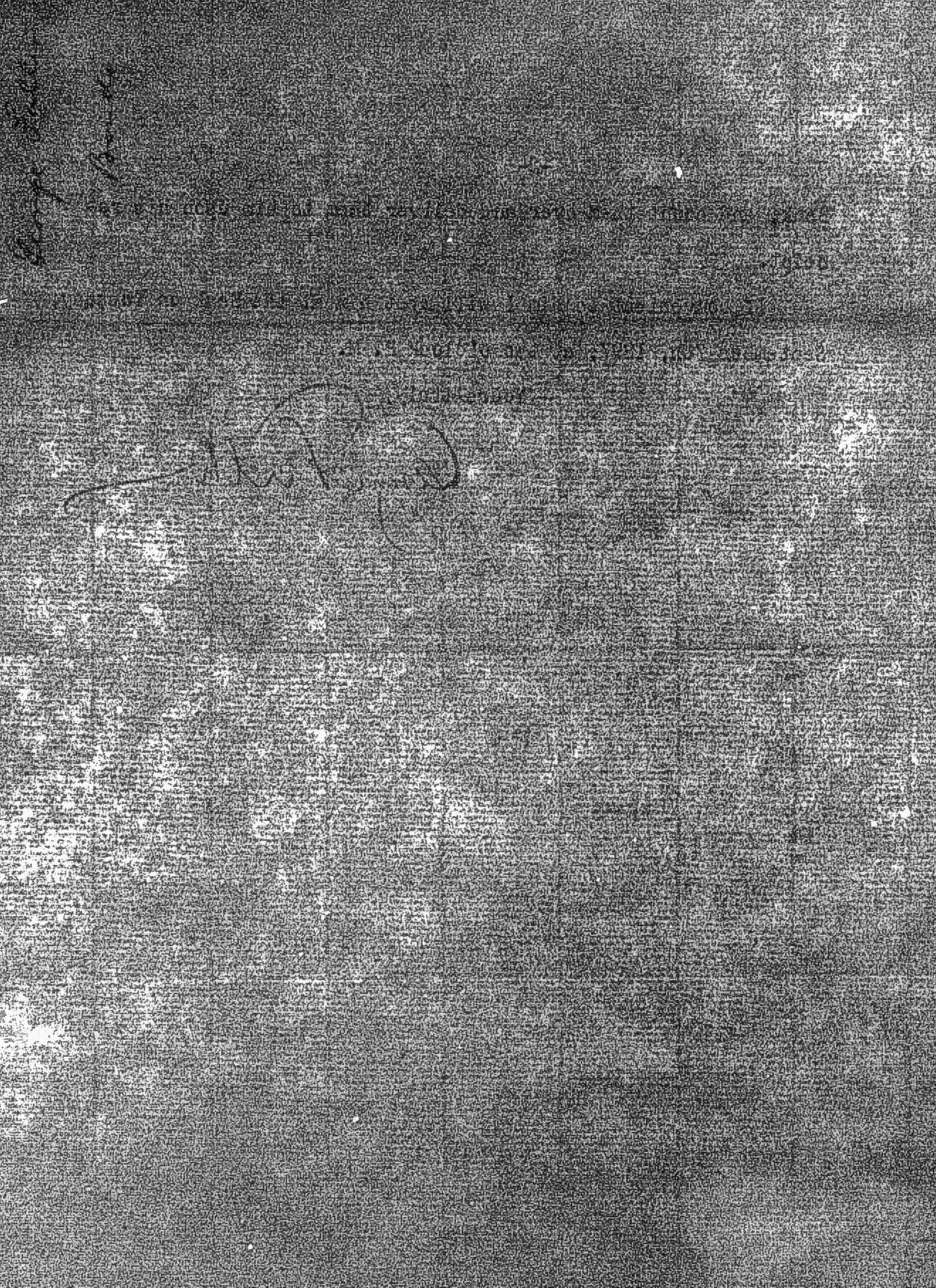
If convenient to him I will meet him at the Bank on Tuesday, September 7th, 1897, at two o'clock P. M.

The Linda Vista Irrigation District, a public corporation, duly organized and existing under and in pursuance of the laws of the State of California, promises to pay to the bearer hereof the sum of FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, on the first day of January and the first day of July of each year. Said principal sum and said interest are payable in gold coin of the United States of America at the office of the Treasurer of said District in the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California. Said principal sum and said interest shall be payable on the first day of January 1914 and said interest shall be payable on the first day of January 1914 and on each anniversary thereafter.

This bond is issued for the purpose of raising the sum of Five Hundred Dollars and is caused to be issued and executed by the Board of Directors of said District pursuant to a vote of said District and is subject to the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, passed on March 17th 1887, and by authority of, pursuant to and upon full compliance with said Act as amended.

All of said bonds and the interest thereon are to be paid by revenue derived from an annual assessment upon the real property of said district, and the assessment upon real property by said Act of the Legislature made a lien against the property assessed.

In Witness whereof the Board of Directors of said Linda Vista Irrigation District have caused this bond to be signed by the President and Secretary of said Board and the seal of said Board, and of said District to be hereunto affixed, and the lithographed signature of said Secretary to be affixed to each of the interest coupons hereto attached, this the 1st day of January, A.D. 1899.

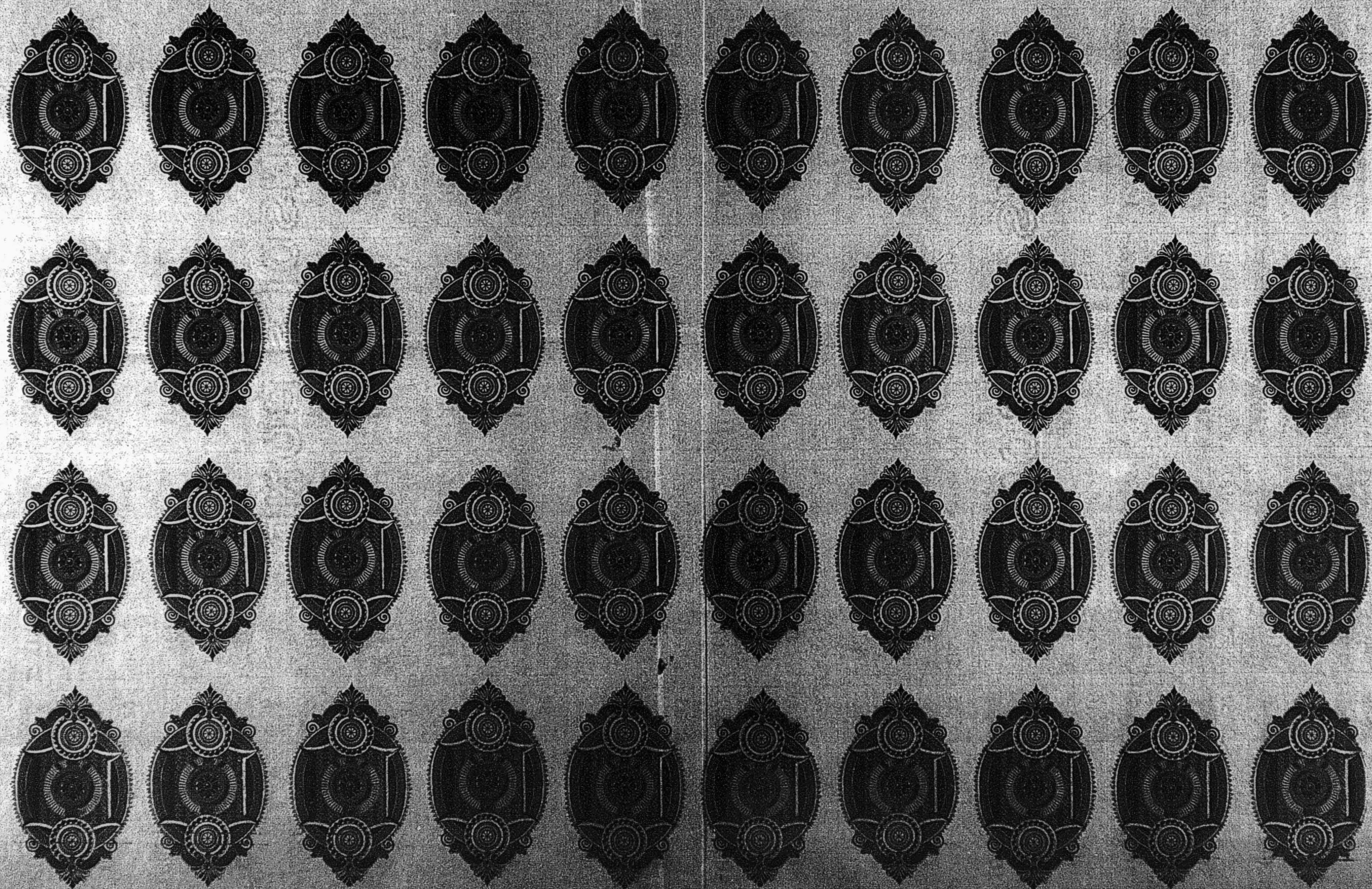

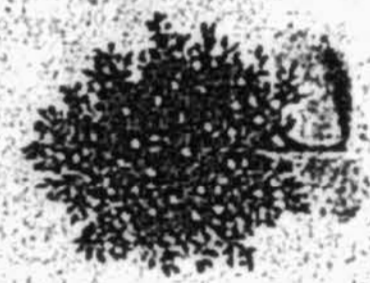

Said principal sum and interest are payable in gold coin of the United States of America at the office of the Treasurer, now located in the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California, on or before the 15th day of January, 1912, and said interest is to be paid on the 15th day of each month thereafter, commencing on the 15th day of January, 1912.

This bond was caused to be executed by the Board of Directors of said District, and the same is hereby certified to be a true and correct copy of the original as the same appears from the records of said District. The sum of Five Hundred Dollars is composed of 320 bonds of the same tenor as this, and the same are a part of the issue No. 1. And all of said bonds are now in the possession of the Board of Directors of California entitled. An act to provide for the organization and government of irrigation districts, and to provide for the acquisition of water and other property, and for the distribution of water, thereby for irrigation purposes, approved, March 7th, 1887, and by authority of, pursuant to and when in full compliance with said act as amended.

All of said bonds and the interest thereon, are to be paid by revenue derived from an annual assessment upon the real property of said district, and the assessment upon real property is by said act of the Legislature made a lien against the property assessed.

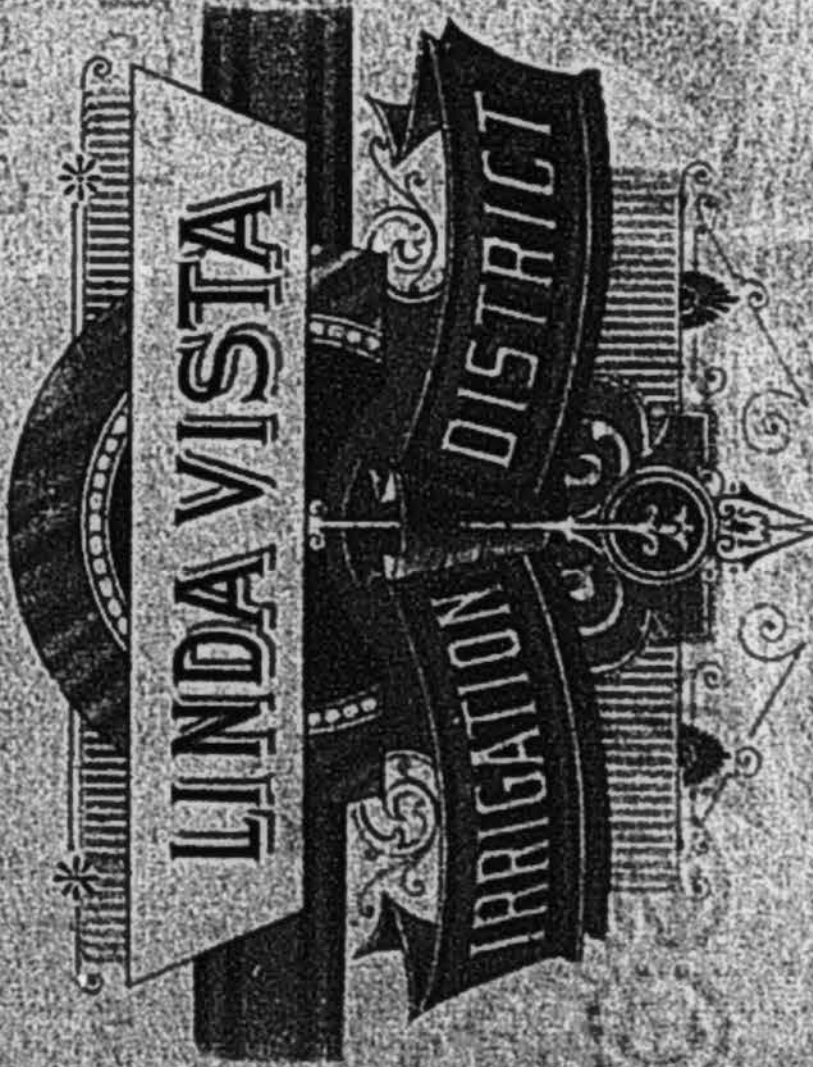

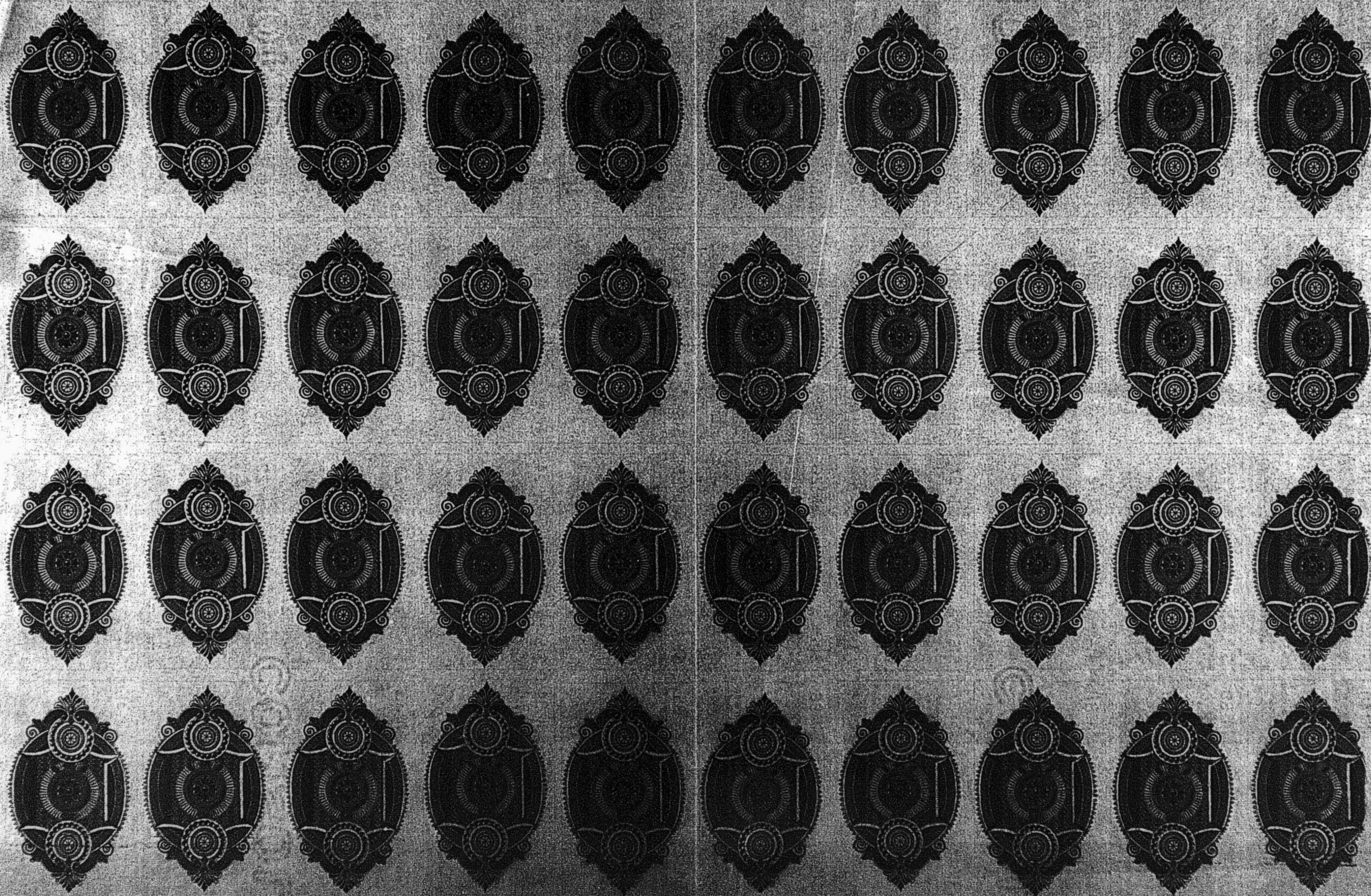
