# Evelyn Lakoff, A Renaissance Woman

A New Yorker through and through, Evelyn Lakoff found herself on alien soil when she arrived in San Diego in December 1974. Her husband Sandy had recently been appointed as the founding chair of the Political Science Department of UCSD. Above their fireplace, the well-known picture of New York -- with the rest of the country receding into insignificance seemed to capture her view of the world.

Very fortunately, Evelyn and the La Jolla Renaissance Singers -- then called the UCSD Madrigal Singers, an Oceanids Interest Group -- soon discovered each other. Evelyn said the group was her cultural life-line. With her broad musical background, Evelyn was a valuable asset to the group. Not only was she a terrific sight-reader, she could quickly identify where problems occurred in all vocal lines. On occasion, she filled in for conductor Mike Mullin when he was out at sea on an SIO cruise. Evelyn illustrated her wonderful sense of humor and artistic talent with occasional gifts to the group such as a paper mask, showing just the top of a singer's head to point out that we all had our heads buried in the music.

Oceanids soon discovered that Evelyn was a talented piano player. For many years she was in demand to lead the carol singing at the annual holiday party. Had she not died of cancer unexpectedly soon on November 25, she would have led the carol singing in December.

Evelyn was also a gifted writer. She was editor of *Bear Facts* from 1984-1988, cajoling articles from others (and often improving them), and writing contributions of her own. She looked forward to working with the *Bear Facts* staff -- and readers looked forward to receiving the entertaining newsletter.

Being a New Yorker, she loved show business and the faculty revue shows (La Jollywood Revues, sponsored by Oceanids) were a perfect fit for her talents. We were a real team: Evelyn, the pianist; Ralph Lewin, the librettist; Mike, the rehearsal director; and I, the coordinating producer. We staged four shows during the late 1980s/early 1990s, including the opening event for the Faculty Club in 1988. In the process, we raised money for the Oceanids scholarship fund and created a university-wide esprit. For all of her contributions to Oceanids, Evelyn was named "Oceanid of the Year" in 1988.

Evelyn's legacy to the cultural life of San Diego was her 20-year leadership as president of the San Diego Early Music Society. Founded in 1981, the Society, essentially operating as a volunteer organization, is recognized as one of the major presenters of early music in the United States. A typical tour of a famed European group might include performances in New York, Seattle, San Francisco, La Jolla, and Boston.

A celebration of Evelyn's life will be held at the UCSD Faculty Club on Saturday, January 6 at 3 pm. Contributions to the Evelyn Lakoff Memorial Fund of the San Diego Early Music Society may be sent to P. O. Box 82008, San Diego, CA 92138.

# News of the International Center Nursery School

There is a very good possibility that the ICNS will move to the Mesa Apartment Complex. There will be considerable expense (many 100,000 dollars) to refurbish the space and playground area. Currently the university administration is talking about which sections of the university should fund the effort. If money can be found, this looks very promising. One advantage is that the ICNS would still be on university property. We should know more by the end of December. If all goes according to plan construction could start in March or April and the ICNS move by the start of summer 2007.

#### 2. Space Planning

We continue to meet and are working toward 3 scenarios for the reconfiguration of the center and the use of the ICNS space. These will be presented to the center director toward the end of January with the changeover of administration. NO details have been set and I will let you know as soon as they are. If you get **seasick** there are over-the-counter medications that do not make you sleepy. Ask the pharmacist.


