

Zable and Hope new officers of Chancellor's Associates

Two San Diego business leaders, Walter J. Zable and Frank L. Hope Jr., have been named as officers of the recently formed Chancellor's Associates at the University of California, San Diego.

Zable, president and board chairman of Cubic Corporation, will serve as chairman of the group and Hope, president of Frank L. Hope & Associates, will serve as program chairman.

The Chancellor's Associates, formed in January, is an outgrowth of the Chancellor's Club which began in 1966 as a means of fostering involvement by community leaders in the growth and well-being of the San Diego campus. The Associates is not a "booster" group in the conventional sense but rather a means through which the Chancellor can develop direct and continuing communication between himself and the community.

In addition, it provides unrestricted funds with which the university can finance special projects not funded by conventional means. Membership in the Chancellor's Associates, which currently has 115 members, is contingent upon an unrestricted gift of \$1,000 or more annually.

Zable, who formed Cubic in 1951, was a charter member of the Chancellor's Club and has been an active supporter of the San Diego campus for a number of years. Prior to forming Cubic, Zable was project supervisor in charge of microwave and antenna development sections at General Dynamics/Convair Division.

Hope, also a charter member of the Chancellor's Club, served as its chairman for seven years. He has had more than 20 years experience in all phases of architectural design, planning and administration and serves as principal in charge of many of his firm's national and international projects.
