CHAMBER MUSIC ENSEMBLE TO SERVE AS REGENTS' LECTURERS AT UCSD

Speculum Musicae, a chamber music ensemble based in New York City, has been invited to serve as Regents' Lecturers at the University of California, San Diego in mid November.

The group's tenure as Regents' Lecturers will include performances at two public concerts, a Department of Music seminar, and master classes and open rehearsals for UCSD music students. All Regents' Lectureship events are free to UCSD students.

Speculum Musicae cellist Christopher Finckel will perform in concert with UCSD professors, violinist Janos Negyesy and pianist Aleck Karis, also a member of the ensemble, at 8 p.m. Nov. 15 in Mandeville Recital Hall. General admission is \$8 and seniors, \$6.

Speculum Musicae, the sextet, will perform in concert at 8 p.m. Nov. 17 in Mandeville Auditorium. General admission is \$20. Included in the program will be Woven Serenade by UCSD music professor Rand Steiger.

At 11 a.m. Nov. 18, members of the ensemble will participate in a Department of Music seminar on Steiger's composition in Mandeville's Erickson Hall.

Regents' Lectureships are conferred by the UCSD Council of Provosts to a person or persons nominated by an academic department and perceived to have broad appeal to the campus audience. The Department of Music Regents' Lectureships are offered to professional performers.
