

Pierre Emanuelli will lecture here

Mr. Pierre Emanuelli, Executive Secretary of the French Association for the Atlantic Community, a private organization pledged to promoting the NATO Alliance, will outline France's role in that alliance at 4:00 p.m., Tuesday, February 13, at the University of California, San Diego.

Emanuelli's talk, titled "Is France Ready to Leave the Atlantic Community," is being co-sponsored by the UCSD Committee for Arts and Lectures and the Department of History. It will be held in room 2722, Undergraduate Sciences Building on the Revelle College campus and is free and open to the public.

Emanuelli was born in Morocco in 1920. He was educated in France and received a law degree from L'Ecole des Sciences Politiques. In 1945 he was appointed Chef du Bureau de la Presse et de l'Information, Office of the Secretary General, during the Provisional Government of the French Republic. Two years later he was appointed Secretary General of the Association for Free Enterprise, an organization founded by the National Council of the French "Patronat" to establish a public relations network of economic information throughout France. He has held his present position since 1959.

Emanuelli has travelled widely and has been a frequent visitor to the United States. In 1962, at the invitation of the World Affairs Council in San Francisco, he addressed the Conference on Atlantic Problems held in Monterey, California. In September of that year, he led a group of 70 members of the French Atlantic Association on a visit within the United States. They were received by Secretary Dean Rusk at the State Department in Washington, D.C.

Since 1964, he has lectured on "France and the Atlantic Community" at over a dozen colleges and universities in the United States as well as to various state and national committees dealing with foreign relations.
