





In a nutshell, Occult Generation is about a pansexual private detective in 1920's New York who investigates the murder of a notorious drag performer and in the process, uncovers a secret war between remnants of the confederacy equipped with strange technology and a secret society in Harlem that fights for justice through magic.

The story pulls from memorable elements of the 1920s era while holding a magnifying glass up to racism, mystics, immigration, queer life, gender roles, body awareness, political corruption and the dawn of equity feminism.

They are raising \$14,500 to cover the cost of creating, producing, printing and distributing Occult Generation. A \$10 pledge receives a digital copy for their first issue.


