UCSD LECTURE ON HITLER TO BE PRESENTED APRIL 7

Adolph Hitler and the Decisions for the Final Solution is the topic of a lecture to be presented at 8 p.m. April 7 in Peterson Lecture Hall 108 at the University of California, San Diego. The lecture is free and open to the public.

Christopher Browning, an authority on the Holocaust and Nazi Germany's Jewish policy and a professor of history at Pacific Lutheran University, will speak. The event is sponsored by the UCSD Center for the Humanities in cooperation with the Judaic Studies Program and the Department of History.

Browning will address such questions as: When were the decisions for the final solution made? What was Hitler's role in the decision-making process?

According to Browning, these questions were at the heart of debates among historians in the 1970s and early 1980s. His lecture will reexamine these old questions in light of new developments from the recently opened European archives.
