

Five-part lecture series sponsored by Urban Studies and Planning on "Who Governs San Diego? Power, Politics, and the Economy in America's Finest City"

"Who Governs San Diego? Power, Politics, and the Economy in America's Finest City" will be the topic of a five-part lecture series to be held during October and November at the University of California, San Diego.

The series, featuring speakers drawn from the world of San Diego politics, business, labor and journalism, is sponsored by the Urban Studies and Planning program at UCSD.

Neil Morgan, editor of The Tribune, and George Mitrovitch, columnist for San Diego Newline, will launch the series on Thursday, October 14.

They will be followed on Thursday, October 21, by two members of the San Diego City Council: Bill Cleator and Mike Gotch.

On October 28, the series will feature San Diego businessman Ernest Hahn and Larry Remer, publisher of San Diego Newline.

Jess Haro, president of the Chicano Federation, and Ken Msemaji, president of the United Domestic Workers, will share the program on November 11.

Tom Van de Veld, head of the San Diego Central Labor Council, and John Mabee, president of Big Bear Supermarkets, will conclude the series on November 22.

All five programs will be held in Conference Room 111A of the Administrative Complex on the UCSD campus. They will begin at 2:30 p.m., with the exception of the program on November 11, which starts at 3:30 p.m. The series is free and open to the public.
