Whereas, these allegations may have been true in the past, they do not exist today at the Coors brewery.



PROPOSAL: OFFICE OF THE STUDENT ADVOCATE

NEED:

The need for the new format of the Office of Student Advocate is primarily derived from the traditional lack of delineation in the job description and duties of the Commissioner of Student Welfare as currently defined in the A.S. Constitution. The Commissioner of Student Welfare's primary duty is to serve the function as the Student Advocate for the University. In this light, he/she represents the student in several different appeals processes; takes up selected issues that concern the general student body as a whole and to basically serve as an information center for students in need of counseling on their rights within the University.

In its present format, however, it is clear that the Commissioner of Student Welfare has continually lacked the direction to accomplish these most basic tasks associated with this office as defined above. The reasons for this concerns several intrinsic problems which I feel will be erradicated within the new format of the Student Advocate Office.

The most basic problem concerning Student Welfare is its lack of visibility and legitimacy within the UCSD Community. To effectively have an active working Student Advocate within the A.S. it first must be recognized and known to both the Student Body, Staff, Faculty and administrative bodies here on campus. Thus the Commissioner of Student Welfare is not. To be effective here, the Student Welfare Commissioner must work out a structured well known and legitimate office in which both students will seek out and use, and the administration will respect and deal with as a true representative on this campus.

PR PROPOSAL:

What is being proposed here is the origination of the "Office of the Student Advocate" as an A.S. backed student service. In this format, the office will be structured by a charter with bylaws to clearly define the duties and tasks of the position. The office itself as defined is to serve as a framework within which one Commissioner of Student Welfare will serve from year to year, becoming the Student Advocate and head of the office itself. As a student "service", the A.S. Council will serve to retain some control over successive budgetary requests of the office from year to year. It is most effective in format as a service because it is designed to directly serve the students with workshops, pamphets on student rights etc. - all of which will entail some monetary expenditure. Let it be remembered, however, that the A.S. will ultimately control this aspect as in any other service.

GOALS:


The goals of the Student Advocate Office are many, primary in importance, and as already stated, is the idea of contracting visibility and legitimacy to the Student Advocate position. I stress the word legitimacy because the whole power of the Student Advocate position is derived almost entirely from how the UCSD Community perceives it as a functioning part of the Associated Students. The visibility of course lends itself to the legitimacy factor, for to be legitimate one almost always must be visible first.

Secondly, it is the unique college system here at UCSD which adds to the need for a centralized advocate office. The goal of the office here is to attempt to coordinate the dispersed appeals process presently in use. Because of the four college system, each college has tended in the past to handle disciplinary and appeal cases independently, and without student input. Because each college does not have a student advocate on hand to counsel students on procedure and due process, gross injustices have occured in the past. The A.S. backed and visible Student Advocate Office will serve to coordinate these separte appeals processes; by both having the students in question seek out the advocate, and having the colleges themselves refer the student to the advocate first for information on the process.

Thirdly, the goal of the Advocate Office is to allow for a smooth and effective transistion of powers from year to year. Through the framework of the office, it is hoped that a minimum of confusion from one advocate to another will be passed on, and a more effective A.S. will be possible at a much earlier date.

ADVANTAGE:

The advantages of the Advocate Office over the present format are numerous, and many should already be clear by this point in the proposal. To have such a service is of great benefit to the A.S. in its visibility to the Student Body and as a viable and truly worthwhile student service. To the student, one of the primary problems at this time is the lack of knowledge of rights and due process procedures. The ability of the office to get out information on these rights and general campus concerns will be invaluable. What the A.S. lacks most is direction. This is what the Office of Student Advocate intends to facilitate.
