PHI BETA KAPPA, UCSD PRESENT FREE PUBLIC LECTURE OCT. 11 ON EDUCATOR'S EXPERIENCES IN SOVIET UNION

The Epsilon Association and Sigma Chapter of Phi Beta Kappa are sponsoring a free public lecture on Friday, October 11 at 7:30 p.m. featuring Irvin M. Lande, an educator and Phi Beta Kappa member, who has just returned from a summer of teaching in the Soviet Union. The lecture will be held in the Robinson Auditorium at UCSD's Graduate School of International Relations and Pacific Studies (IR/PS).

Lande, who is involved in educational programs in Costa Rica, Germany, Belgium, and most recently, Soviet Georgia, is a partner in Advanced Educational Systems International (AESI). He will discuss his recent experiences as an educator in the Soviet Union in a talk entitled "A California Yankee in the U.S.S.R."

The Sigma Chapter of Phi Beta Kappa is based at UCSD. Since its founding in 1776, Phi Beta Kappa, the oldest and most prestigious academic honor society in America, has established chapters at only 250 of the more than 2,000 American institutions of higher learning. The Epsilon Association is the Phi Beta Kappa Alumni group in San Diego. The group draws its membership from about 3,600 Phi Beta Kappa members in San Diego County.
