WALTER HELLER TO GIVE FREE PUBLIC LECTURE

Walter W. Heller, chairman of the Council of Economic Advisors under two United States Presidents, will deliver a free public lecture at the University of California, San Diego, April 7.

Heller's topic will be "Our Haunted Prosperity," and will be held in the Mandeville Auditorium from 3-5 p.m. His appearance is sponsored by the Departments of Economics and Political Science and by the Economics and Management Science Student Association.

He will discuss major agenda items facing the nation and what should be done in the areas of tax reform, the Gramm-Rudman-Hollings Act, inflation, unemployment, and interest rates.

Heller was head of the economic advisors under Presidents Kennedy and Johnson, and twice served as a consultant to the Executive Office of the President. Since 1975, he has been a consultant to the U.S. Congressional Budget Office.

His major contributions to the field of economics include the translation of economic analysis and research into public policy, and the wider dissemination of economic ideas and findings to informed policy makers in business, finance and government.

He is the author of numerous books and articles on economics and public policy including: "New Dimensions of Political Economy," and "The Economy: Old Myths and New Realities."
