## Limited Tickets Available for Opening of Sold-Out "The Atlantic Meets the Pacific" Forum



For the second consecutive year, *The Atlantic*, a magazine that has played a central role in shaping the national debate on current affairs and cultural trends for 150 years, has chosen to partner with UC San Diego to co-host a forum of national prominence on campus.

"The Atlantic Meets the Pacific" will gather some of the country's most cutting-edge thinkers to examine breakthrough innovations in science, energy, health, media, and technology. The conference will be held at venues on and around the UC San Diego campus Oct. 7 to 9.

While the conference is already sold out to the public, UC San Diego faculty, staff and students can still see the venerable magazine's national debate come to life as a limited number of \$25 tickets are available for the opening session from 3 to 6:30 p.m. Oct. 7. The opening event, to be held at the San Diego Museum of Contemporary Art in La Jolla, will begin with a political panel discussion previewing the presidential election and making predictions. *National Journal* Editorial Director **Ron Brownstein** will interview **Steve Schmidt,** former chief campaign strategist for John McCain. **Brownstein** will then moderate a conversation with **Schmidt; James Fallows,** a National Correspondent for *The Atlantic*; **Samuel Popkin**, a UC San Diego professor and author of *The Candidate*; **James Fowler**, a UC San Diego professor and author of *Connected: How Your Friends' Friends' Friends Affect Everything You Feel, Think, and Do*; and **Dan Yankelovich**, a longtime pollster famous for founding the The New York Times/Yankelovich Poll and the Time Magazine/Yankelovich Poll.

A program on entertainment and society will follow with UCLA Law School Alumnae **Stacey Snider**, partner, co-chairman, and CEO of DreamWorks Studios, who is producing Steven Spielberg's "Lincoln," in an interview with **James Bennet**, Editor-in-Chief of *The Atlantic*.

The opening session will conclude with a presentation by **Tal Ben-Shahar**, best-selling author of *Happier*, *Being Happy*, and a new release, *Choosing the Life You Want*.

The forum will include behind-the-scenes tours at Scripps, UC San Diego's Calit2 digital media laboratory, and the Sanford-Burnham Medical Research Institute.
