

To the President and Board of Directors of the Linda Vista Irrigation District:

Gentlemen:-

Having been informed by Mr.T.S.Vandyke, one of the Directors of the Pamo Water Company, that he formed, formulated and prepared the specifications embodied in your notice inviting bids for supplying your district with water, and that he so formed them with a view of forcing the San Luis Rey Water Company to disclose and make known as much data concerning its plant as could be thereby obtained, we therefore conclude that it was not intended or expected that all of said specifications should apply to this company.

Permit us to say, however, that all the data called for, or any other information which you may desire concerning our system, and means of supplying you with water and complying with any contract, will be gladly furnished at our office, where our books, maps, plats, surveyors estimates &c &c will at any time be open to your inspection.

Hence we beg to submit for the consideration of your Hon. body the following proposition, to wit:-

First. We will furnish your district two thousand miners inches of water, to be taken as follows, to wit:-

500 inches or more the first year

500 " " " second "

500 " " " third "

And the balance thereof the fourth year, at the sum of \$350 per inch with an annual rental of \$35 per inch, giving you an option of 500 additional inches at the same price, the exercise of said option to be made within four years from date of contract.

Second,. Or, we will furnish you two thousand inches of water to be taken as follows, to wit:-

250 inches or more the first year.

250 " " " additional the second year.

250 " " " " third "

250 " " " " fourth "

250 " " " " fifth "

250 " " " " sixth "

250 " " " " seventh "

and the balance the eighth year, at the sum of \$400 per

inch, with an annual rental of \$40 per inch, giving you an option of 500 additional inches at the same price, the exercise of said option to be made within eight years from the date of contract. In both cases the water to be paid for as taken.

We have a large quantity of water on hand, our supply, as you perhaps know, being largely drawn from the San Diego River, and will be furnished within six months after execution of contract, and will be delivered at a point on the east boundary line of your district, near the centre thereof, at an elevation of 620 feet.

We are fully cognizant of your earnest desire to serve the interest of the tax payers and people of your district, and, with out system already constructed, and with the means and opportunity of largely developing the same, we confidently believe that we can not only furnish you water at a lower price than any other responsible company, but that we can furnish it in such quantities and at such times as will best meet the needs and wants of your people, thereby saving you, not only the interest on your original investment, but the water rental for water which you might buy and not be able to use.

Dear Sir,

The Linda Vista Irrigation District being entitled to
~~50,000~~
~~50,000~~ miner's inches of water flowing in the Santa Ysabel River
at its proposed dam site, which amount is largely in excess of the
requirement of the District, hereby offers to dispose of ~~50,000~~
~~10,000~~ inches to the city of San Diego with the right to reservoir the
same in consideration of \$30,000 and in further consideration that
the city join the District in constructing a dam which shall cause
to be stored 1,000 inches perpetual flow being 500 inches for each,
and in constructing a pipe line having capacity to conduct 1,500
inches to a point in the District 550 feet altitude, eight miles
distant from the present city distributing system at Pacific Beach,
the expense to be borne proportionately to-wit: One half the cost
of the dam by each, and one third the cost of the pipe line by
the city and two-thirds by the District. The right being reserved
by the District of increasing the capacity of dam with the exclusive
use of water thereby stored.

The estimated cost of dam is \$240,000, and of pipe line \$300,000
thus making the whole amount to be paid by the city \$550,000.

The object of making pipe line of 1,500 inches capacity is that
the District will use its water in six months which means 1000
inches during that period.

As a second and alternative proposition, the District offers to
sell to the city delivered at the point mentioned in foregoing
proposition, 500 inches of water perpetual flow at the price of
\$500 per inch.

As there may exist doubts as to the legality of the District
entering into such contract, it is considered advisable to obtain
an enabling act of the Legislature at its next session as an
amendment to the Wright Act.

At 9 A.M. Friday, October 20, 1888, John C. Snow, Esq., of Boston, Mass., and his son, John C. Snow, Jr., Esq., of Boston, Mass., appeared before the Hon. Wm. H. Brewster, Justice of the Peace, at the office of the Boston Daily Journal, 19 Tremont Street, Boston, and presented a petition for a license to sell water to the City of Boston, for the purpose of irrigating land in the State of Massachusetts, and for other purposes.

The petition was read and the following questions were asked:
1. What is the name of the corporation or company you propose to form?
2. Who are the stockholders?
3. How much money do you propose to raise?
4. What is the name of the place where you propose to sell the water?
5. What is the quantity of water you propose to sell?
6. What is the price per thousand gallons?
7. What is the time when you propose to commence selling?
8. What is the time when you propose to stop selling?
9. What is the name of the person who will be in charge of the business?
10. What is the name of the person who will be responsible for the payment of taxes?
11. What is the name of the person who will be responsible for the payment of debts?
12. What is the name of the person who will be responsible for the payment of expenses?
13. What is the name of the person who will be responsible for the payment of taxes?
14. What is the name of the person who will be responsible for the payment of debts?
15. What is the name of the person who will be responsible for the payment of expenses?

The answers were as follows:
1. The name of the corporation is "The Boston Water Company".
2. The stockholders are John C. Snow, Sr., and John C. Snow, Jr.
3. The amount of money proposed to be raised is \$100,000.
4. The name of the place where the water is to be sold is "The Boston Water Company".
5. The quantity of water proposed to be sold is 100,000 gallons per day.
6. The price per thousand gallons is \$1.00.
7. The time when the water is to be commenced selling is "As soon as possible".
8. The time when the water is to be stopped selling is "When the company is dissolved".
9. The name of the person who will be in charge of the business is "John C. Snow, Jr.".
10. The name of the person who will be responsible for the payment of taxes is "John C. Snow, Jr.".

We have interests in this City which will be beneficially affected by an early determination of the water question and as there are so many business enterprises waiting for a favorable determination thereof before being started we respectfully ask prompt and continuous action so that whichever proposition is accepted will be legally submitted to our Citizens for their approval at the earliest possible moment.
