## WHITEWASH

THE BIG FARMERS HAVE RUINED THE ECONOMY OF IMPERIAL VALLEY :::::

The U.S. Census Bureau reports that in 1945, there were 2,932 farms. In 1959, the farms were reduced to 1,306, a loss of 1,626 farms. These 1,626 little farmers were driven out by the corporation farmers who bought up the little farmers' lamd. TheCensus Bureau also reports that in 1945, there were 65 big farmers with farms over 1,000 acres. In 1959, there are 122 big farmers with farms over 1,000 acres. In addition the average farm rose in value from \$20,000 in 1945 to \$205,000 im 1959.

BUT THE BIG CORPORATION FARMERS WERE NOT SATISFIED WITH DRIVING OUT THE LITTLE FARMERS. They also drove out in the last 10 years, 15,000 domestic farm workers by bringing in Mexican bracers and giving the jobs to the foreigners. The domestic farmworkers and their wives and children, AMOUNTED TO 50,000 people, were good customers of the mer hamts. This time starting in 1952, the depression became severe becaus the braceros did not have their families with them and bought nothing.

So the big farmers have started a "campaign for tourism" to divert the minds of the people from the fact that the big corporations which own 90% of the farmland are ruining the economy of the Valley. Claude Finnell who is paid by us taxpayers has been putting out propaganda in favor of the big farmers. The County Board of Trade which has dome nothing all these years, is controlled by the big farmers. They know that if industry is brought in here, the unions will come with the industries and the workers will vote for the candidates who are against the big farmers. THE BIG FARMERS ARE AFRAID OF THIS AS THEY WANT TO CONTROL THE COUNTY GOVERNMENT AND THE IMPERIAL IRRIGATION DISTRICT!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!
