

## **Wayne Kennedy, vice chancellor for Resource Management and Planning, named chairman of the Board of Management of the Council on Governmental Relations, a national organization made up of 120 leading research universities**

V. Wayne Kennedy, vice chancellor for Resource Management and Planning at the University of California, San Diego, has been named chairman of the Board of Management of the Council on Governmental Relations (COGR), a national organization made up of 120 leading research universities.

Kennedy, currently serving as a member of the COGR board, will begin the one-year term as chairman in September. The post is renewable for a second one-year term.

COGR was established as an outgrowth of the National Association of College and University Business Officers to provide advice and information and to make recommendations to the federal government regarding policies, regulations and practices which affect university research and other sponsored programs.

The council's activities are supported by the universities which receive a major portion of the federal scholarship and research funds through contracts and grants. The 18-member COGR board is made up of university financial or business officers, research administrators, and faculty members in order to give the administrative body a well-rounded university point of view.

Kennedy was named vice chancellor for Resource Management and Planning at UCSD in March 1982, after serving as director of the Office of Planning and Budget at UCSD for one year. He joined the San Diego campus in 1973 as assistant vice chancellor for Health Sciences and associate dean of the School of Medicine.

As vice chancellor, he is responsible for the operation of the Offices of Contract and Grant Administration, Development, and Public Information, as well as the departments within the Planning and Budget organization including Administrative Records, Budget, Campus Planning, Capital Outlay and Space Management, and Internal Audit.

Kennedy received a bachelor's degree from the University of Maryland in 1961 and served for 12 years in various administrative posts at Maryland including assistant dean at the School of Medicine.

Kennedy has served as a member of the University of California Systemwide Administration Committee on Research Management since 1979. In 1980 he was a contributor to the publication, "Partnership Between Universities and the Federal Government" in response to the government study of federal assistance management.
