

Exhibition of replicas of paintings, pottery and bronzes from National Palace Museum at Taipei to be on display

January 23, 1978

A exhibition of replicas of paintings, pottery and bronzes from the National Palace Museum at Taipei, Republic of China, will be on display Monday, Jan. 30, through Saturday, Feb. 4, in The Other Gallery, room 1200, Humanities-Library Building, at the University of California, San Diego.

Among the works to be shown will be the following: a painting of a horseman and chariot from the Han Dynasty (207 B.C.-220 A.D.); a wood carving of a tomb figure from the T'ang Dynasty (618-907 A.D.); a ting or square bronze cauldron, a food container from the Chou Dynasty (1122- 249 B.C.); a cloisonne or Peiping enamel flower vase from the Ch'ing Dynasty (1644-1911 A.D.), and a landscape by Pu Shin-Yu (1912--).

The art works have been loaned by the National Palace Museum and the Chinese Consulate in Los Angeles. The exhibition is sponsored by the Chinese Student Association and the Department of Visual Arts.

Gallery hours are Monday-Friday, noon to 5 p.m. and Saturday, 9 a.m.-3 p.m.
