

6 UCSD graduate students win fellowships

Six University of California, San Diego graduate students are the recipients of five Fulbright fellowships and one DAAD (Deutscher Akademischer Austauschdienst) fellowship for the 1985-86 academic year, it was announced by Dr. Richard E. Attiyeh, Dean of Graduate Studies and Research.

The five Fulbright recipients are in the Department of Anthropology. They are: Sara Dickey, India; Brian Farley, Mexico; Dana Farnham, Africa; Rebecca Joseph, Indonesia; and Dan Linger, Brazil.

The DAAD recipient is Leonard Payton, in the Department of Music. Payton will spend the year in West Germany.

Dickey's project concerns influences of cultural performance (cinema) on class-based social ties in urban south India.

Farley's project centers on changing values and conflicting interests in a Tlaxcalan village. He is currently in the field.

Farnham's project is concerned with population resettlement and socio-economic development in northern Togo, Africa. The scheme to be studied is the Kara River Valley Agricultural Development Project, which has been in operation since 1974.

Joseph's project deals with women and the making of batik in a central Japanese court center. The project aims are to describe the production and exchange of batik textiles from the points of view of the women involved in these activities. She is currently in the field.

Linger's project concerns culture and conflict in northeast Brazil. He will look first at the traditional social anthropological approach to conflict and will study the nature of conflictive events. He is currently in the field.

Payton's project will focus on musical composition from researching sounds available from acoustic instruments. He plans to use his DAAD fellowship to study with Professor Klaus Huber, a composer in Freiburg.

The DAAD fellowship is made possible through an academic reciprocal exchange agreement which, from 1966, has involved graduate students from the Federal Republic of Germany, West Berlin and UCSD.

Fulbright fellowships are awarded under the Mutual Educational and Cultural Exchange Act (the Fulbright-Hays Act, administered and funded by the United States Information Agency).
