

Max Bernd-Cohen serving as Lecturer in Visual Arts

Mr. Max Bernd-Cohen is presently serving as a Senior Lecturer in the Visual Arts at the University of California, San Diego. He is teaching the only fine arts course offered at UCSD with the assistance of Mr. Donald G. Lewallen, who is Art Coordinator, University of California Extension Art Studios, La Jolla.

Mr. Bernd-Cohen came to UCSD to help plan the fine arts program and to teach required fine arts courses to Revelle College students. He will leave this summer to return to his studio in Florida. He is a painter and has been an acquaintance of Dr. John Stewart, Provost of The Second College, for a number of years. He came to San Diego from England where he taught at the College of Art, Carlisle. He was responsible for setting up the Department of Art History and General studies at Carlisle. Prior to his stay in England he was a Visiting Artist at Dartmouth College.

Bernd-Cohen is an American citizen; born in Georgia. He is a lawyer (he holds a Bachelor of Law degree as well as a B.A. degree from Columbia) and has studied in Europe. He has also done quite a bit of lecturing around the country and in Europe.
