

George P. Elliott lecture

George P. Elliott, Professor of English at Syracuse University, will present a lecture titled "Against Pornography" at 8:00 p.m., Tuesday, April 7, in Sumner Auditorium at Scripps Institution of Oceanography. The lecture is sponsored by the Committee for Arts and Lectures of the University of California, San Diego.

Elliott, a graduate of the University of California at Berkeley, is in charge of the creative writing program at Syracuse University. He has served as an assistant professor at St. Mary's College of California, Cornell University, Barnard College in New York City, the University of California at Berkeley, and as a lecturer in the Writers Workshop at the State University of Iowa. His most recent appointment before moving to Syracuse University last fall was as lecturer at St. Mary's.

Elliott is author of Parktilden Village, 1958, Among the Dangs and Fever and Chills, 1961, David Knudsen, 1962, and A Piece of Lettuce, 1963. He has been a contributor of poems, stories, essays, and book reviews to literary magazines such as The Nation; Hudson Review, Poetry, Commentary, and Epoch.

He is a member of the American Association of University Professors and was awarded a Hudson Review fellowship in fiction in 1956 and a Guggenheim Fellowship in 1961.

The lecture is free and open to the public.
