(Dear Sir -

Your letter of the 21<sup>st</sup> inst. is received to day enclosing an order for twenty-eight dollars and fifty one cents also two tax receipts. The description of my lot in the Tax receipt does not agree with the description of the lot in my deed given by you. The Deed says "Lot one (1) in block twenty two (22) of the old town of San Diego as indicated on the Map of Core of Courts of the Old Town" The above is the description in the Deed. The Tax receipt says - Lot 1 Block 406 - You see there must be some mistakes will you please to take the trouble to investigate the matter? It is recorded in Book 8 pages 429 & 430 - W. B. Coats, Recorder. Your bill as rendered is perfectly satisfactory. If all the business we left there unsettled had

have been transacted as faithfully  
as you have performed what was  
left with you we would be worth  
five hundred dollars more than we  
are to-day. Yet we cannot complain  
for success has attended us in the  
lucrative mining speculations -
