

Registration open for summer session

Registration is open for the six-week summer session to be held at the University of California, San Diego July 7 through August 15.

A wide variety of daytime and evening courses will be offered to students presently enrolled in any UC campus, students at any other college or university, high school graduates who can satisfy the prerequisites for the courses they wish to take, and high school students who have completed their junior year with satisfactory grades.

Attending summer session does not constitute admission to UC San Diego for the academic year although work completed in summer session can be helpful to someone seeking regular admission to the campus.

The courses offered are regular UC San Diego undergraduate courses and are taught by UC San Diego faculty or teacher/scholars from comparable institutions.

Courses will be offered in a number of different departments including anthropology, biology, chemistry, history, language, literature, mathematics, physical education, psychology and sociology. In addition, a number of special courses will also be offered. Among these will be marine biology, a literature and music course on "Blues, Ragtime and Jazz," a political science course on the presidency and the U.S. Congress, and a course based on the Old Globe's summer Shakespeare festival and taught by Eric Christmas.
