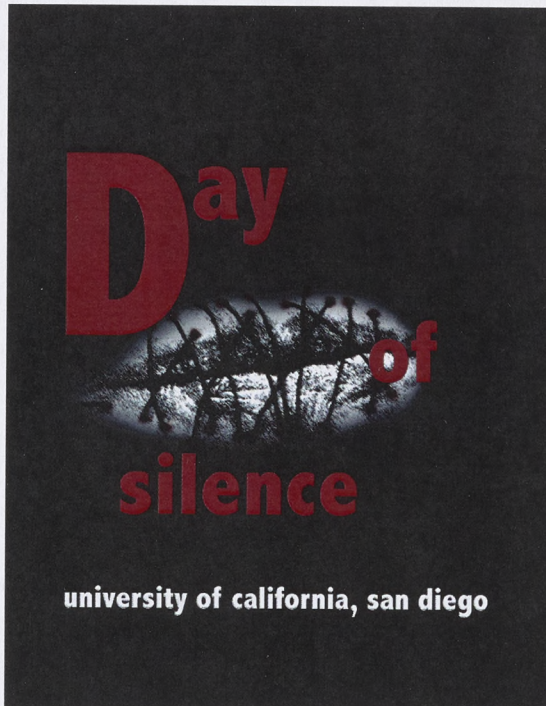

QPOC History

In 1999 some angry people of color, who are queer, were determined to create a space where the intersections of both culture and sexuality could flourish. Queer People of Color (QPOC) originated from former members of the LGTBTA at UCSD that felt that the campus failed to efficiently accommodate the needs of students who felt a strong connection to both their ethnic and cultural heritage as well as their sexuality. QPOC grew to have more members and held weekly general body meetings and had joint events with other student orgs such as MEChA. The first Generation Q Queer Youth Conference at UCSD, Entitled "Generation Q: Out and Proud!" drew dozens of high school and college students to UCSD for a day of organizing, collaborating, and all around fun! In the school year 2000-2001 QPOC became an official member of the Student Affirmative Action Committee (SAAC). After the induction of QPOC into SAAC the SAAC community began to work and incorporate queer issues as their own. Today QPOC is an activist space focusing on the development of Queer People of Color for UCSD students and the greater San Diego Community & the world!

QPOC Allies

The student Affirmative Action Committee (SAAC) began in 1975 and has been the voice of students of color at UCSD and has been composed of the Asian and Pacific Islander Student Alliance (APSA), Kaibigang Pilipino (KP), Native American Student Alliance (NASA), Movimiento Estudiantil Chicana/Chicano de Aztlan (MEChA), Black Student Union (BSU), The Disabled Student Union (DSU), and Queer People of Color (QPOC). These organizations work in solidarity to be the voice and source of much of UCSD people of color activism.

In spring 2007, the member organizations of SAAC came together to campaign for secure funding for the newly new Student run recruitment and retention center now known as the Student Promoted Access Center for Education and Service (SPACES). The referendum Promoting Understanding and Learning through Service and Education (PULSE) passed and secured funding for SPACES, the Academic Success Program, and Student Initiated Access Programs and Services (SIAPS) formerly SIORC. ASP and SIAPS are the retention and outreach components respectively.

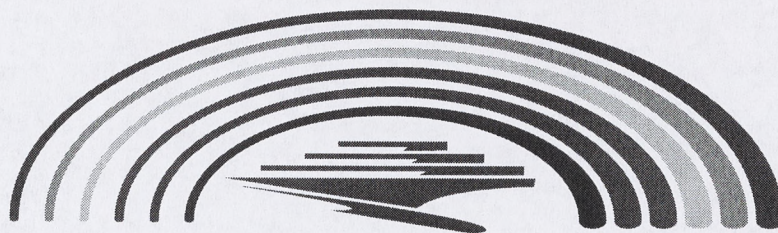

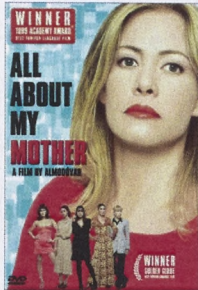

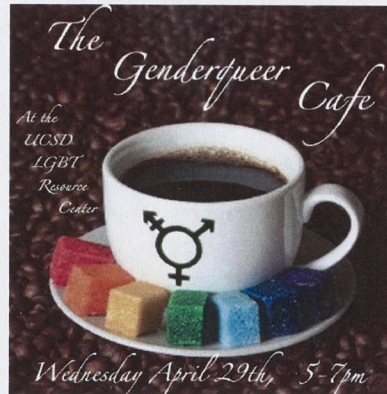
