

Anti-Gay Vandalism in Our Community

Dear UC San Diego LGBT and ally community~

Earlier this week a member of our community had their car vandalized with antigay hate speech. The person reported the incident to the police and has been working closely with the many response and support mechanisms the University provides. Click here for the community advisory that is in the process of being posted on the campus police website, and distributed to the Mesa graduate student housing community.

It is possible that the car was targeted in this instance perhaps because of "Vote No on Prop 8" sticker and/or the rainbow sticker. This incident should heighten all of our awareness around responsibility and safety. UC San Diego has made commitments through the Principles of Community, non-discrimination policies and affirmative statements on diversity to create and sustain environments where incidents like this should rarely occur. When incidents do occur, the entire UC San Diego community has a responsibility to increase its sensitivity to the way people are targeted because of their identities, communities and perceived status. The UC San Diego community also has a responsibility to confront hate wherever it occurs on our campus.

Concurrently, those of us who are targeted must realistically consider what steps

we should take when an incident like this has occurred. For some, that may mean increased vigilance around physical safety. For others, it means conscientiously choosing when and where to be alone, to be visible and to be silent around identities that are targeted.

If anything happens to you or your property that is similar in nature, please call Detective Garrett Williams at (858) 534-4359, or 911 and report it. Again, the community advisory is in the process of being posted on the campus police website, and distributed to the Mesa graduate student housing community.







OUR SPACE

The LGBT Resource Center occupies the top floor of the new building between the Original Student Center and Mandeville Center. Constructed in 2006 with an area of 2,600 square feet, the space was designed from the ground-up with the needs of the community in mind. The Center has public and private space, a large conference room, a small group meeting room, common kitchen, gender neutral restroom, and three offices.

The common room is a drop-in space to sit, read, and chat with friends or colleagues. Attached to the Common Room is our lending library available for browsing. Our multimedia lending library has media on a variety of topics related to sexual and gender identity. Laptop computers are available for check-out and use within our space. It is also connected to a common kitchen, complete with sink, refrigerator, toaster, microwave, and coffee pot. Drop by for a quick snack, or come over and bring your lunch.

Our conference room has a table and chairs, with plenty of space to sit, read, or study. The space has multimedia capabilities and a projector screen. Many of the student organizations related to sexual and gender identity use the space for their regular meetings. The room may be reserved for small meetings, study groups, and other activities.
