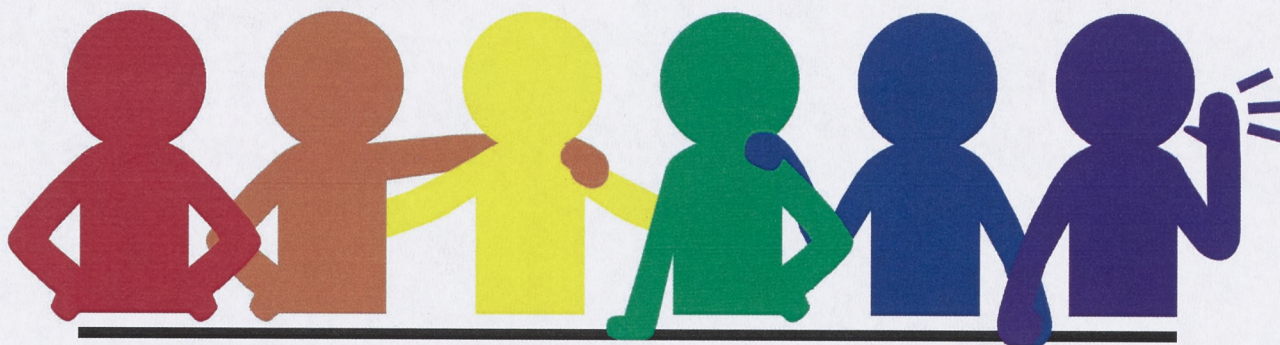

Who we are: A group of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and straight ally identified students, staff, and faculty trained to represent the diversity of the UCSD LGBT community to a variety of groups and organizations interested in providing education regarding LGBT issues.

What we do: We offer three types of panels that help dispel stereotypes and offer an open, frank dialogue about issues related to the LGBT community. The most basic is a “**Traditional Panel**” of 3-5 panelists who introduce themselves and answer questions about LGBT issues and experiences. Our other panel formats are “**I Have Gay Friends**,” which offers a more informal and personal conversation with panelists, and “**Queer Inquiry: An Identity Game Show**”, a game show like panel where audience members guess the sexual and gender identities of the panelists.

Free Anonymous HIV Testing

UCSD Library Walk

The San Diego County Office of Public Health will be providing free, anonymous rapid HIV Testing on Library Walk to staff, faculty and students between the hours of 9:00 am and 3:00 pm. on Thursday, October 30th. Look for the Mobile Unit between Career Services and Student Health Service. The rapid HIV test detects HIV via oral swab; no blood sample is needed. Counseling services and further testing will be available for those with preliminary positive results. Appointments last 20-30 minutes. Most appointments for the rapid HIV test will be on a first-come, first served basis.
