



The LGBT Undergraduate Scholarships

Christopher B. Arrott Gay, Lesbian & Bisexual Scholarship

The Christopher B. Arrott Gay, Lesbian and Bisexual Endowed Scholarship is awarded to a current gay, lesbian, or bisexual undergraduate student with a record of active service and involvement in the gay, lesbian, and bisexual community. This scholarship was established in 1999 by Christopher B. Arrott, who is an alumnus of UCSD. Chris continues his commitment to UCSD by staying connected to the LGBT Resource Center and by serving on the Board of Directors for the UCSD Alumni Association.

This scholarship is awarded to UCSD gay, lesbian, or bisexual undergraduate students with a record of active service and involvement in the gay, lesbian, and bisexual community. This is a one-year award up to \$1,000.

Marx & Marshall Gay and Lesbian Scholarship

This scholarship was established in 1996 by Michael Marx and Donald Marshall, two long-time friends of the LGBT Resource Center. Through their generosity and the generosity of other community friends, this scholarship recognizes students who have strong academic records and are active in the lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender community.



This scholarship is awarded to UCSD gay and lesbian students based on academic merit, who have made significant contribution to the gay and lesbian community. Preference is given to students with demonstrated financial need. Financial need students must be receiving financial aid. This is a one-year award up to \$1,000.

Russ Ty Gay and Lesbian Scholarship

The Russ Ty Scholarship was established in 1998 and is awarded to a current gay and lesbian undergraduate student based on academic achievement. Russ Ty, a UC graduate, had a twenty year career in the U.S. Army and is now retired.

This scholarship is awarded to a UCSD gay and lesbian student based on academic merit and financial need. This is a one-year award up to \$1,000.

UCSD LGBT Resource Center Undergraduate Scholarship

The UCSD LGBT Resource Center Undergraduate Scholarship is awarded to a current gay, lesbian, bisexual and/or transgender undergraduate student based on academic merit and is awarded to a person who has had significant experience with issues related to sexual orientation and gender identity. It is made possible through the generosity of the UCSD LGBT community, and especially through the LGBT Resource Center Advisory Board.



This scholarship is awarded to UCSD gay, lesbian, bisexual and/or transgender students based on merit, need, and significant experience with issues related to sexual orientation and gender identity. This is a one-year award up to \$1,000.

Tracee Parsons Scholarship for UCSD LGBT Students in Math & Science

The Tracee Parsons Scholarship for LGBT Students in Math and Science was established in 2007 in memory of Tracee Parsons, the partner of UCSD faculty member Dr. Deborah Morton. This scholarship is made possible by the generosity of many community friends.

This scholarship is awarded to current gay, lesbian, bisexual and/or transgender undergraduate students based on academic merit, financial need and demonstrated commitment to the fields of math and/or science.

Stephen P. L'Italien, Jr. Memorial Study Abroad Scholarship

The Stephen P. L'Italien, Jr. Memorial Study Abroad Scholarship, established in 2007, is awarded to current gay, lesbian, bisexual and/or transgender undergraduate students based on demonstrated mentorship and leadership in their community, an exceptional record of community service, commitment to sharing international experience both while abroad and upon return, involvement in extracurricular activities and demonstrated academic excellence. Recipients must provide evidence of planned participation in an academic program abroad through the Education Abroad Program, the Opportunities Abroad Program, or UCSD's Global Seminars."

This scholarship is awarded to current gay, lesbian, bisexual and/or transgender students up to \$1,000.

Cause the Bible Tells Me So...

Kari Hong, a lawyer and adjunct professor at the University of San Francisco Law School, presents "Cause the Bible Tells Me So: A Legal History of Religion and the Institution of Marriage." In this talk, Ms. Hong will look at the legal history of marriage and examine the ways in which religion has shaped social and


legal restrictions over who may enter and exit the institution of marriage. From early Christianity's emphasis on celibacy to the Protestant Reformation's rejection of the Church's restrictions, legal definitions have been tied to religious views over who may and may not be married. In the United States, the concepts of coverature, anti-miscegenation laws, no-fault divorce were rooted in religious views and subsequently were altered as social views changed. Viewed from the modern fight over same-sex marriage, the role of religion and the law intersect in ways that show that history truly is prologue.

Prop. 8 and its Driving Forces

An in-depth analysis of the Proposition 8 vote released yesterday shows that party affiliation, political ideology, frequency of attending worship services and age were the driving forces behind the measure's passage on Nov. 4. The study finds that after taking into account the effect of religious service attendance, support for Proposition 8 among African Americans and Latinos was not significantly different than other groups. Through a precinct-by-precinct analysis and review of multiple other sources of data, the study also puts African-American support for Proposition 8 at no more than 59 percent, nowhere close to the 70 percent reported the night of the election. Finally, the study shows how support for marriage equality has grown substantially across almost all California demographic groups – except Republicans. For the full analysis follow [this link](#).

For the Bible Tells Me So: A Legal History of Religion and the Institution of Marriage

Ms. Hong will look at the legal history of marriage and examine the ways in which religion has shaped social and legal restrictions over who may enter and exit the institution of marriage. From early Christianity's emphasis on celibacy to the Protestant Reformation's rejection of the Catholic Church's marriage fees, legal definitions have been tied to religious debates regarding who is pure enough to marry. In the United States, the concepts of coverature, anti-miscegenation laws, and no-fault divorce were rooted in religious views and subsequently were altered as social views changed. Reexamining the modern fight over same-sex marriage through the true history of marriage law, the role of religion and the law intersect in ways that show that history truly is prologue.

Kari Hong is a lawyer with offices in Portland, Oregon and Oakland, California. A graduate of Columbia Law School and Swarthmore College, Ms. Hong has been an adjunct professor at the University of San Francisco Law School, teaching a seminar entitled "Marriage Law." Ms. Hong presently has a criminal, immigration, and civil federal court practice. Ms. Hong has given numerous presentations to national organizations, law schools, and colleges around the country. Her scholarship focuses on the disenfranchisement of same-sex families and discrimination against transsexual individuals. Her scholarship has been cited by the New Jersey Supreme Court and the Texas Bar Association.






