This is to inform you that I am well Henry &  
Leonard is well the Regt is not so sickley as when  
I wrote before Capt Fuller arrived yesterday with  
the clothing he informs me that he has two letters for me  
but left them beyond Norwich and has sent a man for  
them he likewise informs me that my family & friends  
are well. which I am glad to hear

We have 11 Regt in the City 5 at Long Island and one  
at Straten's Island which ~~to that~~ is Col<sup>d</sup> Daterfons Regt  
Straten's Island is 9 miles from the City  
General Washington arrived yesterday and we expect  
Ten Regt more in a few Days. We are fortifying  
York Long Island Governors Island Straten's Island and horns  
hook near half the men are on Deceuty every day  
we expect four Regt will be sent to Quebec in  
a few Days but dont no which Regt
