UCSD ENGINEERING STUDENT AWARDED 1990 GA SCHOLARSHIP IN ENERGY RESEARCH

University of California, San Diego engineering student Eric Monsler has been awarded the 1990 General Atomics Scholarship on Energy Research.

The scholarship is funded through an award made by General Atomics to the late Frederic de Hoffmann, who was the founder of GA and the longtime president of the Salk Institute. De Hoffmann

411 last year became the first recipient of the GA-UCSD Achievement Award, which includes a cash grant to the recipient and scholarship funds in his name to a UCSD program.

De Hoffmann presented the scholarship funds to the UCSD Center for Energy and Combustion Research.

Monsler, a junior from Danville, California, is majoring in systems and control engineering in the Department of Applied Mechanics and Engineering Sciences. He was awarded the scholarship for a three-month summer research project on the energy efficiency of UCSD's Engineering Building Unit 1. The research will be supervised by AMES associate professor Anthony V. Sebald.
