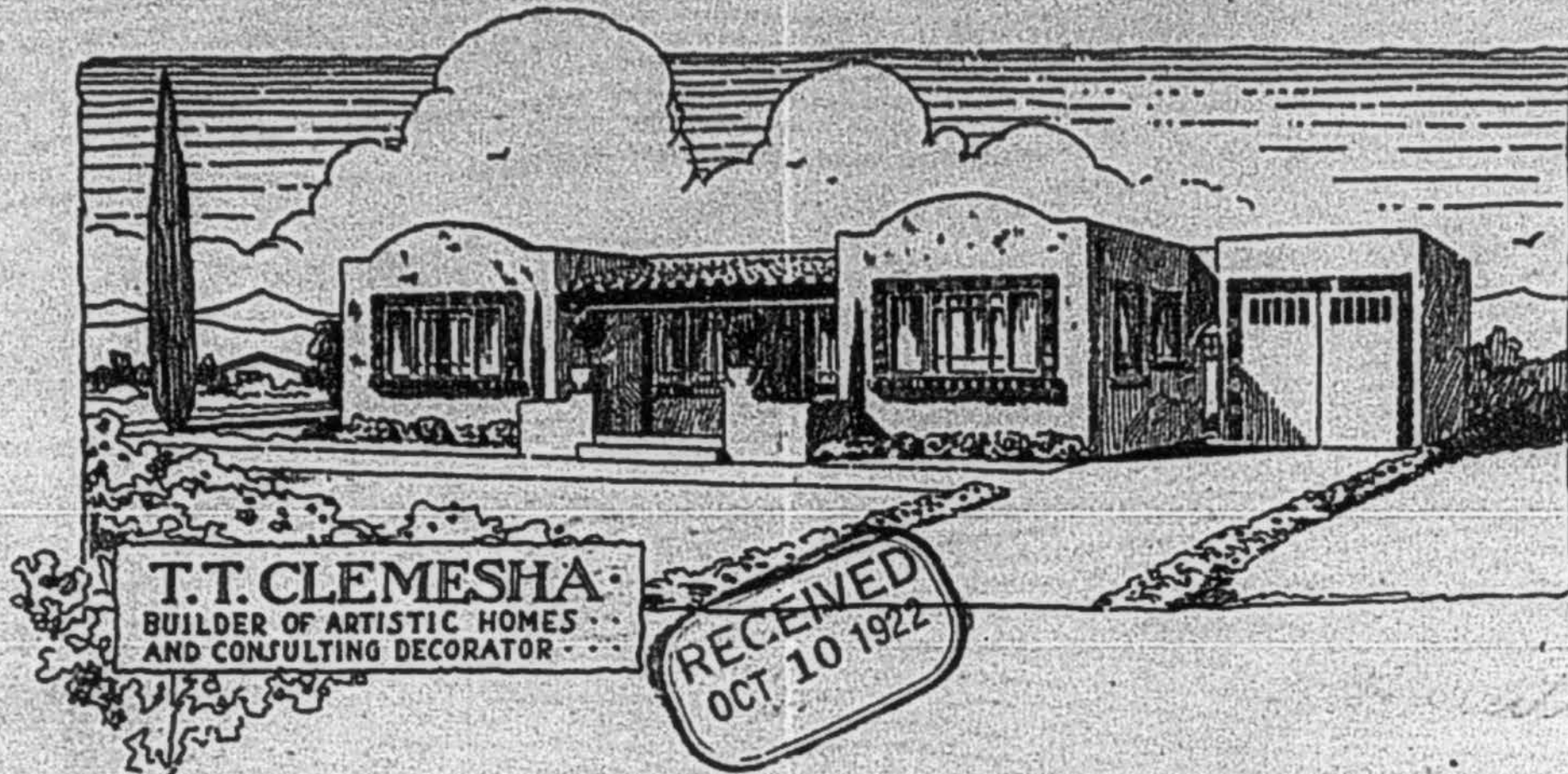

Gentlemen:-

With reference to the water connections in Block 1, La Mesa Heights Townsite, I beg to inform you, that, without realizing that you were the owners of the 2 inch main which was placed in the alley of this block I have removed this main and placed it 18 inches on the inside of my property line on Lots 13 to 24 facing south on Santiago Street.

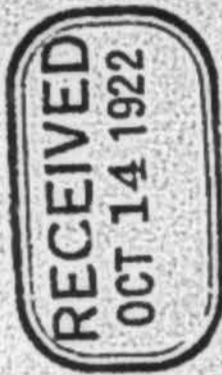
I now fully realize that I have done something which I was not entitled to do and I hereby acknowledge that you are the rightful owners of this 2 inch main and should I, at any future date, sell any portion of this property or dispose of the whole property or make any change which should make it desirable that the 2 inch main should be in the alley, I hereby agree either to place the said main back in the alley or provide a new 2 inch main, properly installed in the alley.

I believe it is understood between us that as long as I hold this property intact for my own use that it is satisfactory to you that this main should remain in its present position.
