

Georges Island June 2nd 1861

Dear Sisters

I have at last got in to employment after waiting 3 months at Guaymas for it - these Islands is the furthest up the Gulph of any and on the Mexican Coast - the most out of the way place of any that can be found on the hole Coast of Mexico as there is not any settlements Excepting a long ways inland and not any vessels pass this way excepting those bound to the Colorado River and they all go up the California Coast and they are so seldom that there is not much chance of hearing excepting by the ships that come here to load and as there is but few fargos here I do not expect to stop here more than 6 or 8 months and then to the Island of Elorro which is further down the Gulph. I then shall be some what nearer Guaymas, I shall then make some contract with Capt. Sham as to working the Island for I want to do some thing more than work for small wages but small as it is it is better than doing

nothing. The trouble with the North & South has reduced the wages this side very much as a great many is coming out this side of the Land and all that I want is to get enough to get the other side with but only think Dear Sisters February 1834 I came around Cape Horn with Capt John E Howell and most of my time has been spent away from my Native place but I am in hopes to see it one more.

You are getting in age and for one that has seen and worked as hard as I have I begin to feel some what in years, but still I enjoy good health with the Exception of the lame Back and that is when I work too hard which is my one fault that I got when I was on the Frase Mountains on the Coast of Chiley with Capt H Babcock my old Friend in Dark Days on the Coast of Chiley what ever has be come of him and Capt J Wade, I wish you would send me a Ang Harbor Paper if there is any one printed in the place for I have not seen one this many or you if you should send me any letters send them to Guymar to the Care of J A Robinson & Co.

then I may get them sooner but dont stop schooling them to Fordham & Janny and Let me hear from you as often as I can Give my Love to Sister Charlet and Eliza My New London Friends I have not heard from Lodowick Murrey for a long time do Dear Sister Let me hear from you wheather you get your money or not if you do Let me hear for it should have been sent you ever since last August with the Exception of three months and

I do not hear from Fordham & Janny often enough to find out any thing by them, My respects to all Enquiring Friends Hoping this will find you all well & say to Henry & Edward they must write me often
