UCSD'S THIRD COLLEGE TO HOLD FINAL LECTURE IN CULTURAL DIVERSITY LECTURE SERIES ON FEB. 20

The University of California, San Diego's Third College will hold the last in a series of lectures on cultural diversity at 7 p.m. on February 20, at the UCSD Faculty Club. The free public lecture will be given by Dr. Michael Rose, director of the UCLA Writing Program and author of "Lives on the Boundaries," a critically acclaimed book on the struggles and achievements of America's underclass.

An authority on literacy policy and practice, Rose, in addition to overseeing UCLA's Writing Program, teaches courses in composition theory, research and pedagogy, as well as literature. Rose also holds a Ph.D. in educational psychology and counseling, and has worked as a counselor and clinical consultant in special education programs.

The Third College Lecture Series in Cultural Diversity is one of the many special events being sponsored this year by Third College in celebration of its 20th anniversary this year.
