

Gray Whale documentary to be presented

A copy of the recently produced documentary, "The California Gray Whale," has been presented to the University of California, San Diego's Scripps Institution of Oceanography.

The presentation was made by the Associates for Contemporary San Diego and the film will be used as a part of the education program conducted at Scripps' Vaughan Aquarium-Museum.

Photographed and narrated by Dr. Theodore J. Walker, associate research oceanographer at Scripps Institution, the film was produced by the National Park Service. It documents the annual migration of the California Gray Whale from the Bering Sea and Arctic waters to breeding grounds in Scammon Lagoon, Baja, California.

The original film is shown daily to visitors at the Cabrillo National Monument on Point Loma. Copies were also presented to the San Diego Board of Education and to the Natural History Museum, which will make its copy available to the public on a loan basis.
