

UCSD to offer variety of summer college courses

More than 250 courses ranging from marine biology to eight languages will be offered by the University of California, San Diego, at summer sessions July 1-Aug. 2, and Aug. 5-Sept.6, 1996.

University students, including those from other countries, high school students who have completed their junior year, and adults willing to make a commitment to serious study, are eligible to attend. There are no admission requirements and no transcripts needed. The average fee is \$300 per course, with a \$40 application fee.

Additionally, UCSD will offer a Summer Scholars program for high school students interested in marine biology, environmental science or health care issues. The two four-week sessions will provide students an opportunity to sample college life.

Students will attend classes, spend a day aboard a research vessel, take a number of field trips and live on campus during the session. The \$2,200 fee includes room and board, tuition and expenses.

An additional program being offered is an archaeology expedition to Israel from July 3 to Aug. 30. The nine-week excavation class includes participation in the new UCSD Nahal Tilah Regional Archaeology Project in Israel's northern Negev desert. Students and faculty will live in a tent camp near the excavation site.

Following the excavation, students will learn the basics of archaeological data analysis by helping process artifacts at the Nelson Glueck School of Biblical Archaeology at the Hebrew Union College in Jerusalem. The total fee, including air fare, room, board and tuition, is approximately \$2,685.

An Intensive Language Program will be held on the UCSD campus from July 1-Sept. 6. Classes will be offered in Chinese, Japanese, French, German, Greek, Italian, Latin and Spanish, and will range from six to nine weeks. The average fee is \$400 for five units, plus the \$40 application fee.
