

A symposium on civil disobedience

A symposium on the question of civil disobedience - what it is and its legality - will be held at 4:00 p.m. Friday, December 2, in the Humanities-Library Auditorium on the campus of the University of California, San Diego. The symposium, sponsored by the UCSD Department of Philosophy, is free and open to the public.

Participating in the discussion will be Dr. Robert Rowan, from the University of British Columbia and presently a Visiting Professor at the University of California, Berkeley; Dr. Stanley Moore, Senior Lecturer in Philosophy, and Dr. Herbert Marcuse, Professor of Philosophy, both at UCSD; and Mr. Walter Koppelman, Assistant Professor of Philosophy at San Diego State College, who will serve as moderator.

Dr. Rowan is well known for his work in the area of civil disobedience and conscientious objectors. Dr. Marcuse has achieved an international reputation both among philosophers and laymen for his work on modern social theory. Dr. Moore is known for his work in the field of moral and political philosophy.

A question and answer period for the audience will follow the symposium.
