SAN DIEGO faces the challenge of developing new skilled workers. Many people in their prime working years have forgotten those math and reading skills they learned in school. Therefore, they lack: (1) the qualifications to take the "next step-up" on the job, or (2) the qualifications necessary to enter a training program or to get a job.

PROJECT STEP-UP offers the community a Learning Center that will provide job related and community centered education for the residents of San Diego who are underemployed or unemployed. All those things in the community that affect an individual's life will serve as resources for teaching reading and mathematical skills. The students will learn more about their community while they are improving their employment possibilities.

THE PROJECT STEP-UP Learning Center will be open from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. on Monday through Thursday and from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Friday. Instruction is individualized through the utilization of programmed learning and small group activities. At the Learning Center the student will be able to work out his own time schedule for learning. To accomplish the most possible in the shortest period of time, students should plan to spend three to six hours a day at the Learning Center.
