

Series of public lectures by Phil. Dept. UCSD to be given at Sherwood Hall

A series of free, public lectures on the relevance of philosophy today will be offered by the University of California, San Diego, starting Tuesday, November 5.

The talks, which will include lectures by the three faculty members of the newly-established Philosophy Department at UCSD, will be given at Sherwood Hall, Art Center in La Jolla. All begin at 8:00 p.m.

The lectures are designed for the general public. They are sponsored by the UCSD Committee for Arts and Lectures.

Tuesday, November 5, Dr. Avrum Stroll, Professor of Philosophy, UCSD, "Philosophy and Conceptual Models."

Tuesday, November 12, Dr. Roderick Chisholm, Chairman of the Philosophy Department, Brown University, "A Problem in Contemporary Philosophy."

Monday, November 18, Dr. Jason L. Saunders, Professor of Philosophy, UCSD, "The Ancients, the Moderns and What There Is."

Monday, November 25, Dr. A. I. Meldin, University of Washington (Seattle), "Philosophy, Psychology and Ethics."

Tuesday, December 3, Dr. Richard H. Popkin, Chairman of the Department of Philosophy, UCSD, "17th Century Philosophy and Its Relevance Today."

The UCSD Philosophy Department is one of the first departments in the humanities to be established in the growth of the campus to general status. It is the first to offer instruction, with nine graduate students this fall.
