

Announcement of Open House

April 1, 1985

A look at an electron microscope, visits to the computer center and science labs, watching a college bowl match and hearing lectures are some of the things visitors can expect from noon to 5 p.m. on Sunday, May 5 during the University of California, San Diego Open House.

There will be mariachis, music from Musica del Pueblo, and a presentation by the Ballet Folklorico to commemorate Cinco de Mayo, along with musical presentations by Cecil Lytle, Jimmy Cheatham's Jazz Ensemble, and the UCSD Wind Ensemble. Also, there will be performances by the UCSD Gospel Choir, folksinger Sam Hinton, and the TKO rock band.

UCSD's Scripps Institution of Oceanography will offer tours of the aquarium, tide pool visits, a photographic display of underwater marine life, visits to the Scripps Pier for photo opportunities and scenic viewing; and tours of the "Old Scripps" building for some historical displays, a video display and a photo display of the research platform, "Flip." A shuttle bus will leave and return to the UCSD campus at 15 minute intervals.

There will be booths and demonstrations by the UCSD School of Medicine, including information on the Burn Center, the Cancer Center, the Communicative Disorders Clinic, the Poison Information Center, a hands-on demonstration of equipment used to monitor brain waves and take voiceprints, and there will be a demonstration by the Life Flight helicopter.

Free lectures will include topics such as, "The FBI as Literary Critic: The File of Bertolt Brecht," "Doctors to Everest," "Urban Design in San Diego," and "The Shape of Things to Come," a lecture in physics.

The Mandeville Gallery will be open to the public and the Grove Gallery will be open for its San Diego Potters Guild show, with demonstrations in the UC Crafts Center. A student panel will discuss what it's like to be a UCSD student, and there will be panel discussions by the Institute on Global Conflict and Cooperation and the Student Pugwash.

Other activities will include tours of the campus, fitness tests, blood pressure checks, a bioimpedence testing area, a rowing ergometer, intramurals games, a 10 kilometer run and a shorter competition in the morning, including breakfast and showers; an underwater triathlon, a Renaissance Faire, open science laboratories, and a demonstration by the UCSD Division III women's volleyball national championship team.

There will be free parking, delicious edibles, a chance to purchase UCSD T-shirts and other items, and free swimming. For more information, call Tom Rutter at 452-3800.
