

Chamber Orchestra under violinist Rafael Druian

The Chamber Orchestra of the University of California, San Diego will present a concert under the direction of noted violinist Rafael Druian on Sunday, February 28, at 8:30 p.m. The event will take place in room 2250 of the Humanities and Social Sciences Building, Muir College. Admission is free. Druian, former concertmaster for George Szell and the famed Cleveland Orchestra, is regarded as one of the leading artists of this country. Currently he is Associate Dean of Music at the California Institute of the Arts, and serves as music director for the Young Musicians Foundation, a resident company of the Music Center in Los Angeles.

He has made numerous recordings of twentieth-century violin pieces and of chamber works; his most recent recording included four Mozart sonatas, with the late George Szell as pianist.

This year Druian has been commuting to San Diego to direct the UCSD Chamber Orchestra.

Sunday evening's program includes works by Bach, Barber, Hindemith, and Haydn.
