

Arvid Anderson, Chairman of the Office of Collective Bargaining will lecture May 13

Arvid Anderson, Chairman of the Office of Collective Bargaining for the City of New York, is scheduled to lecture on "Collective Bargaining and the Future of Public Education" at 3:00 p.m. Tuesday, May 13, at the University of California, San Diego.

Anderson's talk, sponsored by the UCSD Department of Political Science, will be held in the Revelle Formal Lounge located on the south side of the Revelle Commons. The talk is free and open to the public.

Anderson, head of collective bargaining for the City of New York since 1968, will spend four days on the UCSD campus as a Regents' Lecturer under the sponsorship of the Department of Political Science. In addition to his public lecture, he will meet informally with social science faculty members and will serve as a panel member during a special meeting of the Academic Senate dealing with collective bargaining.

Anderson attended the University of Wisconsin where he received a B.A. degree in 1946 and an LL.B. in 1948. He served as Commissioner and Executive Secretary for the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission and as a lecturer in the Department of Economics at the University of Wisconsin for 19 years before taking on his present duties in New York.

He has had a number of articles dealing with labor arbitration, public employment and collective bargaining published in journals and law reviews including the Proceedings of the 27th annual meeting of the National Academy of Arbitrators published in 1974.

Anderson is a member of the American and Wisconsin Bar Associations, the National Academy of Arbitrators, and the American Arbitration Association. He serves as a member of the Board of Directors of the Society of Professionals in Dispute Resolution.
