

UCSD among colleges and universities to receive direct grant from Eastman Kodak Co.

The University of California, San Diego is among 118 four-year publicly supported colleges and universities to receive an unrestricted direct grant from the Eastman Kodak Company as part of Kodak's 1973 Educational Aid Program.

The grants are based on the number of graduates from these institutions who joined Kodak within five years after graduation and are currently in their fifth year of employment. Kodak contributes \$250 for each academic year undergraduate or graduate - completed at a publicly supported school.

The UCSD grant was given for Gary L. Robison who received a Master of Science degree in chemistry at the San Diego campus in 1968 and who is now with the Kodak Park Division.

Kodak has contributed educational grants totaling \$3.5 million to colleges and universities during 1973. During the past decade, nearly 600 institutions have received approximately \$35 million as part of Kodak's support to higher education.
