Jackie Speier, a California State Senator who may run for the office of Lt. Governor of California.

Senator Speier became seriously interested in politics, after having been part of a congressional delegation under the leadership of US Rep. Leo Ryan which was investigating the Jim Jones cult in Guyana in 1978. The group consisted of reporters and relatives of the cult members. As many might recall this group was shot at on the runway when they tried to flee and several were killed. After that the mass murder/suicide took place in Jonestown.

As a state senator she was also responsible for the introduction of legislation to protect consumers.

#### IN MEMORY OF JEAN LINDSLEY

Jean Lindsley, a very beloved member of Oceanids, passed away on July 18, 2005.

Jean had been an active member of Oceanids since the late 1960s, when her husband Dan joined the UCSD Biology Department. Although Jean was busy raising her four children and eventually teaching science at the Bishop School, she still had time to be an active member of the Oceanids Newcomers' Committee and the Garden Club. Once she retired from the Bishop School, (where she was a very loved and inspirational teacher), she had more time to devote to Oceanids and she was involved in many activities. If she was in town, she could be counted on to be working at the Fall Newcomers' events, the Whale Watching Trip, and she and Dan loved the spring camping in the Anza Borrego Desert. If there was a job to be done, Jean was an eager and generous volunteer. When Frieda Urey no longer hosted the Sounding Board meeting at her home, Jean offered her house and if people forgot to bring a sandwich, Jean provided food. Eventually Sounding Board moved to the Faculty Club, but as late as last spring Jean was there to collect the money for lunch and to welcome the speaker. She regularly brought coffee to the Oceanid Board meetings, and to other Oceanid outings and receptions. Jean served on the Oceanid Board for many years, and was co-president with Beth Spooner in 1993-94 and with Carol Schultz 1994-95. To each of these jobs she brought enormous competence and enthusiasm and a generosity of spirit to which we all responded with love and appreciation.

Oceanids celebrated Jean's 70th birthday at Cindy Black's Restaurant in February 1995, and in June 2004, a party was held to honor her as the first recipient of the Oceanids Special Service Award. Both she and her husband Dan were native Californians and they were sweethearts since they were in High School in South Pasadena. They had been married 58 years, and had four children, seven grandchildren and one great-grandchild. Jean loved life, and even when she was recuperating from a terrible auto accident, and then another one, she kept a positive attitude. Even in her final illness, she toasted life. At her request, there was no formal memorial service. She will be missed by so many of us.

#### The 5 Piaster Haircut (1924)

My hair had to go. I was 6 going on 7 and the pressure from my 3 older sisters, to keep my hair combed, was unbearable. Very fine, pale blond, it was mostly in a cobwebby tangle. As far as I was concerned, you got it combed before breakfast, and that was that for the rest of the day. Not acceptable to my three older sisters, I had come ,round five years later to be number 4 sister, and there's the rub. A situation like that should be firmly avoided, but I had no choice. Nor apparently had my parents, I found out years later. They were resigned and reasoned that if they were to be blessed by yet another child, it could easily be a boy for a change, whom they would name Felix. Cob-web hair is bad enough, but "Felix"?! A close call, I escaped that one by being a girl. Still, three older sisters who bossed, combed, hampered, supervised, controlled, body-guarded, scrubbed, petted, made a lap dog of and untangled me – was burdensome for my six years. I decided to ease the pressure and take things into my own hands: my hair had to go, like my papa's every summer. He'd get it completely clipped off. Said it was cooler that way. I envied him. I envied him very much. My hair was superfluous too. My mama who was mostly always on my side, was a very wise lady. She finally gave in to my persistent begging (whining?). gave me five piasters and said I could have my hair shorn any which way I wanted tomorrow morning.

Promptly when tomorrow morning came, I was off. I raced down to the village where the barber had his little alcove in the souk (=bazaar, the ed.). It was always fast going down. The village of Gazier in Lebanon where we lived, had a wide Roman road running through it: wide flagstones with a 2 to 3 centimeter rise at intervals (negotiable by chariots I suppose, though I never saw anything but mules or donkeys on it). It was wonderfully fast flying down it, but always laboriously slow going up. The barber sat me down in his chair facing a blank wall, and then promptly disappeared. I waited. Five minutes passed, and then ten. Had he lost his clippers? More minutes passed. I waited...

While we're waiting for the barber, let me explain why we were living in a remote Lebanese mountain village. It was where my parents had found refuge for several hundred Armenian orphans in an ancient monastery. My mother was in charge here, while my father tended to an adjoining clinic. They were a doctor-nurse team on the order of Médicins Sans Frontièrs, backed by a Swiss mission...

(Could the barber be sharpening his clippers? But no, he's sitting in front of his store chatting with some passers-by. Quite a number of people actually...) ...I'm still waiting so let me reminisce and tell you that years and years later while on a visit to my mother, I asked her if she remembered my old hair clip and how I had to wait and wait and wait for it to happen. Yes, she remembered alright, and since this was long before the advent of the telephone, the barber had sent his young son up to find her and tell her what I was up to. "Do what she wants and be sure she pays you", she'd told the boy... At last my barber is back. I continue.... So I got my hair cut off and then with the clippers down to a fine stubble.

Ahh, how light-headed I felt! I was done! I put my straw hat on. What a funny feeling. My hat rode not directly on my head but on stubble! AND ABSOLUTELY NO COMBATABLE HAIR. No wonder papa did this every summer. Me too from now on! I gave the barber the long clutched 5 piaster piece and was off, but surprised to see a sizable number of villagers at the door, gasping and solemn, no doubt in admiration of how well I had behaved, and not at al/like the silly little children I had seen who squirmed and cried when getting a haircut. I walked out and then flew up the <u>Boman</u> road.

It's been over 80 years now but I still remember the funny feeling of how my hat bounced on my stubbly scalp. But I have no recollection of how my three sisters reacted.
