

Dutton and Blank receive cancer research grants

Grants for cancer research have been made by the American Cancer Society to two investigators at the University of California, San Diego.

Dr. Richard W. Dutton, associate professor of biology, will receive \$47,476 for "studies in the control of proliferation and differentiation in immune response."

Dr. Ann Blank will receive \$14,540 over a two-year period for postdoctoral studies under the direction of Dr. John N. Abelson, assistant professor of chemistry. Dr. Blank, who recently received her Ph.D. in biochemistry from UC-Berkeley, will conduct research "to determine the nucleotide sequences in messenger RNA's from animal and bacterial viruses."
