The University of California's Institute of Geophysics and Planetary Physics will hold its fourteenth annual technical conference on the University's San Diego campus starting Thursday morning, November 16, and lasting through November 18.

The conference will hear 25 scientific talks dealing with such topics as cosmic rays, the Mohole project, radioactive fallout, waves and tides, and variations in gravity and magnetism.

Among the speakers will be Willard F. Libby, University of California, Los Angeles, a 1960 Nobel prize winner, and E. N. Parker, Enrico Fermi Institute for Nuclear Studies, University of Chicago. Parker will be featured speaker at a dinner for the conferees at La Valencia Hotel, La Jolla on Friday evening.

The Institute of Geophysics and Planetary Physics is a statewide University research organization with branches on the Los Angeles and San Diego campuses. The local group is headed by Walter H. Munk.

The Scientific sessions will be held in Sumner Auditorium, on the San Diego campus, and are open to interested observers. A complete program can be obtained from George Backus of the San Diego campus.
