

Music education lecture by violinist Louis Krasner

Louis Krasner, world-famous violinist, will conduct a seminar on music education with emphasis on the violin at the University of California, San Diego, Sunday, October 24.

The seminar, to be held at 3:00 p.m. in the Art Gallery on the Matthews Campus, is free and open to the public.

Krasner has been personally associated with the Viennese School composers Alban Berg, Arnold Schoenberg and Anton Webern. He was soloist in the premier performance of the Berg Violin Concerto, a piece written especially for him by Berg. He also introduced to Europe and the United States a concerto by Schoenberg which has been performed with the Philadelphia Orchestra under Leopold Stokowski, and in New York under Dimitri Mitropolous.

Krasner's concert tours include Vienna, Rome, Berlin, London, Stockholm, Paris and numerous other capitals all over the world. His many recordings include Schoenberg and Berg concertos, the Schoenberg Serenade, and the Piston Sonata.

Also an educator and lecturer, he has held lecture-recital seminars at Harvard University, University of Chicago, Dartmouth, Michigan State, Illinois and others. He is presently associated with the Department of Music at the University of Syracuse in New York.
