

Miami String Quartet to appear at UCSD

The Miami String Quartet, considered one of the nation's finer young quartets, will appear in concert at 8 p.m. April 22, in Mandeville Auditorium at the University of California, San Diego.

Tickets for the event are \$18 for general admission and may be purchased from the UCSD Price Center Box Office or from TicketMaster outlets.

Founded at the New World School of the Arts in Miami, the quartet has performed throughout the United States and Europe. In 1992 it became the first string quartet in a decade to win first prize in the Concert Artists Guild New York Competition.

The ensemble consists of Felicia Moye and Cathy Meng Robinson, violin; Chauncey Patterson, viola, and Keith Robinson, cello.

The program at Mandeville Auditorium will consist of Mendelssohn: Quartet No. 1 in E Flat Major, Opus 12; Adolphe: String Quartet, No.4 (1993), "Whispers of Mortality"; and Smetana: String Quartet No. 1 in E minor "From My Life."

During its 1993-94 season, the ensemble performed the premiere of Bruce Adolphe's "Whispers of Mortality," a work commissioned by Concert Artists Guild.
