Members of San Diego's diverse lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgendered community will have an opportunity to establish shared goals and develop framework for accomplishing those goals at Rainbow Summit '99: Blueprint for Action, to be held on March 5 and 6 at the Metropolitan Community Church. Representatives of the LGBT community have been organizing Rainbow Summit '99 since November 1998 under a grant from the San Diego Foundation for Change. Over a dozen LGBT community organizations have participated in the preparations for the summit. The collaboration of these groups ensured that diverse viewpoints would form the final format and agenda of the summit. The major purposes of Rainbow Summit '99 are to improve communication between different sectors of the LGBT community, develop a plan for training and mentoring future community activists and leaders, and draft a blueprint for addressing community issues and needs. To these ends, the summit will feature workshops on the interpersonal and technical aspects of communication; addressing community diversity; and youth concerns and outreach. Each workshop will identify goals related to the workshop topic. In a general plenary session that follows the workshops, summit participants will select major goals from among those identified by each workshop. The general session will also lay the groundwork for future community development. Registration and check-in for Rainbow Summit '99 will begin at 6:30 p.m. on Friday, March 5. The opening plenary session will start at 7:00 and will feature welcome addresses by organizers of the summit and local leaders. A keynote address by a nationally prominent speaker will highlight the evening. On Saturday, March 5, the program will begin at 9:00 a.m. with a general plenary session followed by breakout sessions addressing the various workshop topics.

The Summit will conclude with a town hall format plenary session which

MOMENTUM GAINING FOR DAY OF SILENCE PROJECT

On April 9, 1999, thousands of students at high school and colleges across the United States and Canada will stay silent, passing out cards advocating

queer equality rather than speaking. These students will be participating in

the Day of Silence.

The purpose of the Day of Silence is to create a visible, "audible" silence to protest the oppression forced upon lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender youth. It also hopes to offer educational tools and dialogue devoted to ending the silence by organizing post-event forums and breaks. Participation in the event has grown exponentially from a single campus in 1996 into an international effort. For the first time, the Day of Silence Project has chosen to adopt a theme: "Unity through Diversity." By focusing on this topic, DoSP hopes to encourage dialogue about the unique issues facing diverse segments of the queer community. The Project expects that these conversations will allow the community to unite to protest homophobia and heterosexism. Chloe Palenchar, Co-Chair of DoSP, comments: "We want to help others recognize how as a community we can achieve equality by through our diversity -- along gender, sexuality, race, class, age, educational status, and every other line." The Day of Silence Project Team is composed of volunteer youths from across the country who are dedicated to fighting for queer rights. Their energy and focus is garnering momentum and recognition as April 7 approaches. Co-Chair Jessie Gilliam comments "schools across the nation are gearing up to fight oppression and end homophobia on this day. We invite you to join our Project and work to end the silence."
