NUCLEAR ARMS CONTROL AND NEGOTIATING WITH THE SOVIETS...The Institute on Global Conflict and Cooperation, headquartered at UCSD, has several experts available to discuss current nuclear arms control negotiations. HERBERT YORK (534-3357) is director of IGCC and a former arms negotiator at the Comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban Treaty, conferences in Geneva... GERALD JOHNSON (534-6894) is a new research associate at IGCC with a long and distinguished background as a SALT negotiator and is also a former delegate to the nuclear test ban treaty negotiations...ALAN GREB (534-3352) is associate director of IGCC and has studied problems relating to nuclear arms control.
